This was an opportunity to embed key messages, explore the Childline website in detail and discuss the importance of having safe adults in their lives. As ever, we were very proud of the children and their sensible attitude towards this important topic.



ANTI-BULLYING

As an infant academy we deliver assemblies and PSHE lessons relating to anti bullying to the children. Much of this is based around how bullying is defined/or recognised and the different forms of bullying there are. Incidents of bullying are very rare here at Dudley and we will always work with our children to support them to understand the impact of bullying behaviour. Our behaviour policy and anti bullying policy also include details of how this type of behaviour will be dealt with. As a school community, it is important for us all to have a good understanding of what constitutes bullying behaviour, and how we can encourage the children to recognise that it is different from disagreements they may have with friends or, importantly, one off incidents with other children. 
