- Students in Grades 7-12
- Admission is contingent upon each individual institution's requirements
- Earn HS and College credit at the same time
- Students are governed by the college (admissions, processes, requirements, deadlines, paperwork, grading, etc.)
- Off-campus and On-campus options
- Colleges have the final decision

- Students in Grades 9-12
- Preferred by highly prestigious institutions
- Requires an exam to be awarded college credit
- Enable students to grow academically through wider variety of assessments
- Classes are at LHS
- Grades in AP courses do not factor into college GPA

***Students can participate in both CCP and AP**



College Credit Plus and AP: Applying for IEP and 504 Accommodations

- **College Credit Plus**
 - Students must go through their selected college to apply for accommodations
 - Students can reach out to the institution's Student Accessibility Services, Student Services office, etc.
- **AP**
 - Students will receive accommodations in the classroom automatically
 - Testing accommodations are submitted for approval to College Board by Associate Principal with signed consent
 - If a student is already approved for PSAT and SAT accommodations, they will receive accommodations for AP testing



Advanced Placement (AP)

- Having an AP course on your transcript shows that you are prepared to challenge yourself with rigorous coursework
- The AP Student will potentially earn college credit if they do well on their AP exams
- Please keep in mind there is a fee to take the AP test for each course and each college requires a different score to be awarded college credit

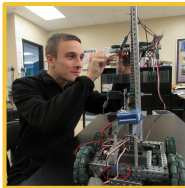

West Shore Pathways to College Credit

- **WebXams**
 - End of course exams for Career-Tech
 - Guaranteed at a state school that has an aligning program/course
- **Articulation Agreement**
 - Partnerships between West Shore and Colleges to award students college credit
- **Students must meet the requirements and complete necessary paperwork**
- **West Shore has agreements with Tri-C, Kent State, University of Akron, and other institutions**

CollegeCredit PLUS

- **Students in Grades 7-12**
- **Earn high school and college credit at the same time**
- **Options**
 - On-campus
 - Off-campus
- **Students must apply and complete college's requirements (testing, paperwork, application)**
 - Students are governed by the college (admissions, processes, requirements, deadlines, paperwork, grading, etc.)
 - Colleges have the final decision as to student's admission
- **FERPA**
 - Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act
 - HS-parents and students have equal access
 - College-only students have access
- **CCP Probation**
 - Cumulative college GPA of lower than a 2.0
 - Withdrawn from, or received no credit for two or more CCP courses in the same term

CCP Timeline/Process

- **April 1st - (NO EXCEPTIONS)**
 - Turn in the CCP Intent to Participate, CCP Mature Content Form, LHS Transcript Request & CCP Permission Slip forms to the LHS School Counseling Office
- Discuss process, options, and CCP with your school counselor
- Complete College/University CCP application and requirements by deadline
 - Students must complete the college application independently or seek assistance from their school counselor
- Meet with college counselor to discuss class selection
 - Please do not wait until the last minute to do this



What Classes Can Students Take?

- Colleges may have restricted courses for CCP until they have earned 15 college credits
- Some classes are not eligible for CCP funding
 - PE, individual lessons, etc.
 - Student can self-pay
- Students may choose courses that are not available at LHS
- Students must meet prerequisites for course - different for each college

Prerequisites from specific colleges / specific course criteria may be required.

CCP Benefits

- Earn credit for both high school & college
- Complete college degree sooner & save money
- Retain freshman status for financial aid
- CCP credits are guaranteed to transfer to any state university in Ohio



CCP Cautions

- College grades are computed into college and high school GPA
- College transcripts are permanent records
- If a course is failed or dropped after the deadline, districts will seek financial restitution
- Exposed to coursework geared towards adult learners

CCP Eligibility Requirements

3.00 cumulative unweighted **high school** GPA

OR

Obtain at least one remediation-free score on the ACT or SAT as determined by the Ohio Department of Higher Education:

- *ACT English of 18, ACT Reading of 22 or ACT Math of 22.*
- *SAT Evidence-based Reading & Writing of 480 or SAT Math of 530.*

Students with at least a 2.75 cumulative unweighted **high school** GPA will be evaluated by the Office of Admissions to determine if ACT or SAT scores are required.

7th and 8th grade applicants without an established high school GPA must take the ACT or SAT.

Course Placement Requirements

*Applicants admitted without test scores, or applicants with test scores who do not automatically place into college-level courses will be required to complete placement testing through the University. Students **must** have either an ACT Reading score of 16, SAT Evidence-based Reading & Writing of 430 or Accuplacer Next Generation Reading score of 237 to place into **Introduction to Psychology (PSYC:100)**.*

How to Apply

- Complete an Undergraduate Admission Application
- Submit school transcripts
- Print and Submit the Signature Page & Permission Slip
- Submit ACT or SAT scores (*optional for applicants with a 3.0 cumulative unweighted high school GPA*)
- The summer/fall application deadline is **April 15**
- The spring application deadline is **October 15**

CCP Overview

- Program for students in grades 7-12
- Students earn college credit and high school credit at the same time
- No cost to the student for college tuition and books*
- Students can choose any college course that applies to a degree/certificate program (excluding remedial, private instruction, physical education, study abroad and religious courses)

**Dependent upon funding approval from the Ohio Department of Education*



CCP Benefits

- Earn college credit for free
- Take classes in summer, fall and/or spring semesters (30 credits maximum per year)
- CCP courses are weighted the same as AP or IB courses
- Each college course of three or more credits counts as a yearlong high school course
- Large selection of courses
- Advanced, challenging and rewarding environment



Why choose CCP at Tri-C®?

- Convenient locations
- Various teaching formats — in-person, hybrid, online (synchronous and asynchronous) and at participating high schools
- Class time options — morning, afternoon, evening and weekend

Getting Started as a CCP Student

(Preferred Tri-C deadline: April 15)

- Intent to Participate form due by April 1 to high school counselor (required by the state)
- Complete online Tri-C CCP application and CCP Mature Content permission slip
- Submit transcript or qualifying ACT/SAT test scores to determine eligibility
 - Depending on GPA and grade level, Tri-C placement test may be required

CCP Registration Process

- Receive decision letter and registration instructions via email
- Submit Mature Content questionnaire
- Meet with school guidance counselor to discuss courses you will take
- Submit Tri-C's authorization to attend form
- Meet with Tri-C Counselor to choose courses that will fulfill degree requirements
- Register for courses
- Attend a College Credit Plus Orientation

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

CCP Admission Criteria

You must meet one of these requirements:

HIGH SCHOOL GPA:

Cumulative, unweighted 3.0+ GPA

OR

HS GPA AND TEST SCORES:

Cumulative 2.3+ GPA **and** 16+ ACT **or** 880+ SAT

OR

GRADES:

Cumulative 2.75+ GPA **and** "A" or "B" grades in relevant high school coursework

Some college courses may require additional placement tests with noted scores:

ENGLISH 101 PLACEMENT

20-25 ACT or 26-31 SAT Verbal **OR**
Writing Placement Test with English Department

PRE-CALCULUS (COLLEGE ALGEBRA) PLACEMENT

22+ ACT or 530+ SAT Math **OR** 18+ Algebra Placement Test

STATISTICS PLACEMENT

22+ ACT or 530+ SAT Math **OR** 18+ Algebra Placement Test
