B. Discuss and act on recommended 2022-23 School District Budget (Exhibit)

The FY 23 district budget request is \$36,131,708.98. The budget is increasing by \$922,550.97. The overall budget increase is 2.62%. RSU 22 received \$135,007.73 in additional state subsidy over last year toward this increase. Also, unallocated fund balance is being dedicated in the amount of \$650,000. An additional credit of \$736,458.66 is related to the increase in the state share now paid to fund 55% of Essential Programs and Services (EPS) and to mitigate increases to taxpayers. Several services and positions will be funded through Elementary and Secondary School Education Relief (ESSER) funds. These services and positions will need to be reviewed closely in the next budget development cycle as they would be additions into next year's budget and could create "a financial cliff". It has been discussed with administration that these services and positions are considered to be mostly one-year needs.

Primary goals of the FY 23 budget include attention to Strategic Plan goals, Pre-K expansion, payroll and benefits increases related to last year's contract negotiations (increasing teacher salaries in our district to be much more competitive), addressing both academic learning and social emotional student needs and focusing on equitable programming access across RSU 22. Hampden Academy Athletics for lacrosse and girl's ice hockey co-op participation are also included.

Holmes moved that the Vote entitled, "Vote to Call and Approve the Warrants for the Budget Meeting and the Budget Validation Referendum and to Authorize the Notice of Amounts Adopted", be approved in form presented to this meeting and that a copy of said Vote be included with the minutes of this meeting. HEAD OF SCHOOL REPORT

Dave welcomed questions on the previously distributed Head of School Report. The list of college acceptances is impressive and includes Columbia, Dartmouth, University of Michigan, Michigan State, Brigham Young, Johns Hopkins, UMaine, and more. Decision Day is 1.

Admission Director Beth Campbell reported on enrollment. Graduating its largest known class of 146 students, the school is looking to replace its 24 international seniors. 31 new international student applications have been processed. Thus far, 22 international students have accepted offers (4 from China; 4 from Vietnam; 5 from Germany; 1 from Switzerland; and 12 from Italy). 21 current international students are eligible to return. Beth reminded the board that Chinese students have historically been full-pay while students from other countries are subsidized. On the day side, 115 welcome letters were sent and to date 79 students have enrolled; emails have been sent to each outstanding applicant and follow-up phone calls will be made to those families this week. It is typical for some deposits to come in after the deadline.

Dave spoke to the stringent travel restrictions being imposed by China. Dave will be travelling to an agent fair in Vietnam in June where he will meet agents from all over Asia, including Vietnam and China. He also plans to connect with past and current Vietnamese school families while there.

FINANCE

Chair James Strout welcomed questions on the committee minutes. It has been a longtime goal of the board to increase faculty compensation to bring the school closer to its public school counterparts and thus attracting and retaining faculty. James commented on committee faculty representative Brendan Murphy's advocacy for his colleagues.

Motion:

To approve an average compensation increase of \$1,800 for all full-time employees to be reflected in May 2 employment letters, with discretion for the Head of School to make adjustments for part-time employment and other considerations.

Strout/MacKay

Approved without opposition.

Dave explained that raises are made in a dollar amount rather than in percentages to keep compensation increases equitable. Fixed dollar amount raises result in a higher percent increase for employees at the lower end of the pay scale. On a point of clarification, raises are prorated for part-time employees. The state of Maine has pushed for all teachers to make more than \$40,000. Currently, John Bapst has a small number of teachers that are below \$40,000.

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS

Chair Jim Lacadie welcomed questions on the Building and Grounds minutes. Bill Meier reported that the school has abandoned its application for the city grant to improve the school's facade; after more research, it was determined that the grant does not align with the school's needs and that the resources required to complete the application and the unlikeliness of a substantial award outweigh the possibility of approval. Penobscot Theater approached the school about leasing space for the summer months and has yet to make a decision. [As of this writing PTC opted out of leasing.] A small number of our international students will be paying to remain in the dorms over the summer as travel restrictions make it very difficult for them to return home.

DEVELOPMENT

Chair Cheryl Fasse invited questions on the minutes. The annual fund is far ahead of where it typically is at this time of year – it is at approximately \$155,000 and *total* giving for the year is at \$189,000. Board members and their families are encouraged to participate in the school's first ever virtual 5K – board members, like students, are welcome to use a treadmill at the Darling Center – contact Angela for access. The *Back to Bapst* alumni weekend is July 23-25 and board members are welcome to attend. The weekend concludes with the 12th Annual Golf Tournament – board members and/or their businesses are encouraged to play and/or sponsor the event – a mailing is going out soon. "Phase 2" of the capital campaign is on the horizon (focusing on a technology and community center, including a dining hall and kitchen).

ENDOWMENT

Matt Skaves reported that the school's portfolio continues to hold strong at over \$2 million, despite the recent downturn in the market. Currently 25% of the portfolio is in fixed income and cash while 75% is in equities. The committee continues to strategize to maximize earning potential, including moving toward Exchange Traded Funds and away from individual equities. A new member, Sebastian Lobe, a current parent and UMaine professor, is joining the committee.

NEXT BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

The final board meeting of the year is scheduled for June 14 at 7 a.m. It will be an in-person meeting.
