





Weather the First Week of January 2022


January 2022 Weather Forecast

This January is predicted to be cold and wet throughout the month. On January 1st the high will be 25 F and the low will be -3 F, 36% of rain/snow. January 2nd the high is 28 F and the low is -2, 48% chance of rain/snow. January 3rd the high is 26 F and the low -4 F, 54% chance of rain or snow. January 4th the high is 31 F and the low is -2 F, 65% chance of rain/snow. On January 5th the high is 31 F and the low is 2 F with a 71% chance of rain/snow. January 6 has a high of 26 F and the low is -2 F, it has a 16% chance of rain/snow. Then last for Friday, the 7th, the high is 28 F with a low of -4 F, with a 66% chance of rain/snow. On the 8th there's a 55% chance of rain and snow with a high of 22-32 and a low of 6-16.





