Community

Located 100 miles east of New York City, Shelter Island is a rural haven of 8,000 acres between the North and South Forks of Long Island. Deep water harbors, beautiful beaches, sailing, and golfing are some attractions of this oasis where one-third of the island is protected by the Nature Conservancy. Access to the island is by car ferry from Greenport on the North Fork and North Haven on the South Fork. The population of the island fluctuates between approximately 2,250 year-round residents to as many as 10,000 residents during the summer season. A self-reliant spirit is emblematic of island life. In addition, the Shelter Island Educational Foundation, the local Chamber of Commerce, Lions Club and the 10K Run Community Fund enhance the community and support our students, the school, and its programs.

The goal of the Foundation is to reach beyond the school district budgetary constraints and geographic isolation by augmenting the resources for individual teachers, students, and community members.

Class Rank, Weight, Grading & Conversion Table

The Shelter Island Union Free School District Board of Education has adopted a "no-ranking" policy. Due to the small size of or school, the Board believes that the practice of determining class rank does not give a clear picture of a student's performance. AP and college level classes will be weighted by 1.1; and honors classes by 1.05 in the GPA. All grades are numerical. In grading, a teacher considers the student's test grades, class work, class participation, homework, and any special assignments. The teacher assigns a grade in accordance with the policy.

School

We are a PreK-12 school with an enrollment of 180 students housed within one building. The average class size is 13 with a student-teacher ratio of 5:1. Certified by the New York State Board of Regents, Shelter Island School employs 37 professional staff in addition to five teachers aides, a guidance counselor, a school nurse, a school psychologist, and a school social worker. 83% of the professional staff have masters degrees, 16% have bachelors degrees and 1% have doctorates.
