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
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#### **The Senior Capstone**

#### HEAR FROM OUR STUDENTS



**Ariana Butler** spent her Capstone experience at Essent, shadowing Marty Nebel, Chief Security Officer. Her essential question was, "What are the steps necessary in creating a business?" Throughout two weeks, she saw the importance of cybersecurity and privacy in a business and the role the company plays in securing the data of consumers. Ariana learned about different terms commonly used in the cyber world, such as TCP/IP, which describes the way the devices connect to the network and the internet to send and receive data. She attended a security meeting, learned about the third-party protocols Essent uses when connecting with other companies, and shadowed a member of the security team as he traced different cyberattacks. The center also creates many publications and certification courses, which aim at educating health care professionals and the general public on current bioethical dilemmas facing the healthcare system. These conversations helped her understand how international law is practiced to accommodate different governments, regulations, and cultures.

### Paoli Hospital

**Nurse Anesthesia** 

**Elizabeth Dougherty** spent her Capstone experience at Paoli Hospital alongside Ms. Andrea Williamson, Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist. Elizabeth's research question was, "How does anesthesia affect the brain?" She observed several surgeries, including two gallbladder removals, hip and knee replacements, a lymph node removal, a septoplasty, and a cranioplasty. The experience allowed her to deepen her understanding of the complex dynamics of the operating room and the critical role of a nurse anesthetist. She observed the entire process of anesthesia administration—from putting patients to sleep, to monitoring them throughout the surgery, to waking them up post-surgery. Her time at Paoli expanded her knowledge and appreciation of the field of nursing and overall healthcare.



#### GlaxoSmithKline
