Message from the School Board

The Shelter Island Board of Education is pleased to have adopted a fiscally responsible budget that is within the District's allowable Tax Cap, and that maintains all of the educational opportunities and programs that will help prepare our students for the 21st century. The budget is in alignment with our mission to engage and empower our students, as they explore both our island and the world beyond it.

The Shelter Island School is committed to offering our students opportunities in academics, athletics, music, the arts, social-emotional learning, character education, and extra-curricular activities. All elementary teachers will teach literacy and math next year, with grades 2-5 utilizing a team teaching instructional platform that will allow for departmentalization and collaboration for science, social studies, and writing. Our secondary curriculum will continue to offer new elective courses, and we will be adding Driver Education during both the school year and summer months. We have offset the loss of the elementary chairperson position by assigning those duties to existing administrative personnel, and will now have a full-time social worker that will help us to meet state mandated requirements for mental health services. Grants will provide funds for technology improvements, as well as training for our teachers in school safety, literacy, and character education initiatives.

The adopted budget also continues the security enhancements supported by the capital grant from Assemblyman Fred Thiele, with safety upgrades such as window security film, additional cameras, and new, more accessible lockers for our students. We also continue to strengthen our partnerships with community-based organizations such as the Mashomack Preserve, Sylvester Manor, the Perlman Music Program, the Historical Society, the Shelter Island Lions Club, the League of Women Voters, Brookhaven National Labs, the Group for the East End, the Public Library, the Retreat, and the Shelter Island Police and Fire Departments.

All of our Board members have devoted many hours of their time to ensure that we meet the needs of all students, and that the needs of community members are given equal consideration. We are grateful for the support and involvement in our district.
