SCHOOL & COMMUNITY

Antelope High School is a public comprehensive school located in the community of Antelope, California. Antelope is primarily a suburban middle class community. Antelope High school serves grades 9-12 and fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) with the most recent WASC approval occurring in 2024. Antelope High School operates on a four-by-four bl schedule, with the school year split into two 18-week terms. Students are enrolled in four classes each term, which is equivalent to two traditional semesters. Therefore, each semester-long course at Antelope High School is equal to a yearlong course in a traditional high school

MARKING SYSTEM

Letter grades of A, B, C, D, and F are used. Cumulative GPA is computed using a 4.0+ scale and includes all work completed in grades 9 - 12. The transcript includes both weighted and unweighted GPA as well as a State GPA, which excludes freshman grades, as well as all P.E. grades. AP, IB, Honors, and some community college classes that are board-approved and transferable to the University of California are weighted. If a course is repeated, the higher grade is calculated into the GPA

Academic Merit Award: Awarded to Sophomores (certificate), Juniors (lapel pin), and Seniors (medal) in the following categories:

Academic Letter: 3.5 GPA (weighted) every grading period through Junior year (awarded at end of Junior year)

Principal's Cord for Academic Excellence: Red and Silver Cord, 3.75 GPA (weighted) every grading period of high school

Seal of Biliteracy: Red and Black Cord, proficiency in English (3.0 GPA in ELA classes or 'standard met' in CAASPP, or 3 or higher in AP English course or 480 or higher on SAT Reading and Writing) AND proficiency in another language (3.0 GPA over 4 years of a world language program or 3 or higher on a world language AP exam, or passing a district approved assessment).

Student Government: White cord, 5 semesters of Student Government participation, participation in Student Government class senior year

Performing Arts: Black Cord, 2.5 overall GPA, 7 semesters of performing arts classes, participation in 4 performances, participation in performing arts senior year, in good standing senior year

Visual Arts: Black Cord, 2.5 overall GPA, 6 semesters of visual arts classes, participation in at least one art show, participation in visual arts senior year, in good standing senior year

Speech and Debate: Red and White Cord, 3 semesters of Speech and Debate, participation in 3 tournaments, participation in Speech and Debate senior year

Internship program: Purple stole, participation in site or district internship program
