Shepaug Valley School was completed in 1971 and designed to provide a quality education for the students of Bridgewater, Roxbury, and Washington, Connecticut and is also a school of choice for students in Sherman, Connecticut. In the fall of 2019 the Agriscience Academy at Shepaug opened, welcoming students from 10 surrounding towns and current Region 12 students who are passionate about a future in Agriscience. Shepaug is a comprehensive public school grades 6-12 with an enrollment of 486 students, 352 of which are high school students, 169 are Agriscience Academy students and 60 faculty members.

Commonly referred to as the Shepaug Experience, the learning community is known for rich and diverse programs, class sizes that maximize student engagement in intellectual pursuits, close relationships between teachers and students, and a reputation for excellence.

THE SHEPAUG EXPERIENCE

In order to uphold our Core Values and achieve our Learner Outcomes, Shepaug features a professionally equipped theater, an Olympic-style swimming pool, a planetarium, and a well appointed arts and technology wing equipped with a television studio and designed to introduce our students to a broad range of career, creative, and technological pursuits. The school provides state-of-the-art technology for student and teacher use. The library houses more than 12,500 print volumes, periodicals, and resource materials in a variety of media.

Shepaug's Agriscience Academy completed its sixth year of operation offering pathways in animal science, equine science, plant systems, food science and power, structural & technical systems. All Agriscience Academy students will benefit from classroom and laboratory instruction, Supervised Agricultural Experience, and membership in the National FFA Organization. All three components create a holistic, layered-learning platform for students.

ACADEMIC COMMITMENT

As part of our core values, Shepaug students have opportunities to earn Academic Commitment Recognition for each course, defined as follows:

- Showing ability to set long and short term goals
- Demonstrating purposeful commitment to classwork
- Exhibiting perseverance and achieving quality work

LEARNER OUTCOMES

Through culminating classroom projects, juniors and seniors have multiple opportunities to demonstrate competency in the identified Learner Outcomes necessary for graduation: Solving Problems, Defending Conclusions & Judgments, Engaging the Creative Process, and Answering a Call to Citizenship. These outcomes are demonstrated across the curriculum, and are based upon rigorous skill sets that prepare students for the twenty first-century.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

To demonstrate our *Answering A Call To Citizenship* Learner Outcome, students complete a minimum of thirty hours of community service.

SENIOR PROJECT

Senior Project is a full-year course that provides a real world culminating experience to our high school program. All students choose a unique project to research and develop through their senior year. Areas of evaluation include research, implementation, technology, interpersonal skills, and commitment. Shepaug seniors defend their senior projects at the end of the school year in public forums.

SUPERVISED AGRICULTURAL EXPERIENCE (SAE)

All Agriscience Academy students are required to complete a Supervised Agricultural Experience annually. The SAE is an integral part of their agricultural education that allows students to demonstrate what was learned in the classroom but also provides the student the opportunity for mastery based learning. Among numerous other benefits, students can gain experience in agriculture and/or agriculturally related areas. Along with classroom/laboratory instruction the SAE program truly prepares students to be college and career ready.

SHEPAUG STUDENTS: ACTIVE AND INVOLVED

MODEL UNITED NATIONS: The Model United Nations team participated in the Harvard Model United Nations last year. There were students from over 40 different countries at the conference that totaled over 3,000 students. 24 Shepaug students attended the conference as delegates representing the countries of Ethiopia and Nicaragua. Students analyzed international issues through the lens of their assigned countries serving on a variety of different committees, including economic, financial and humanitarian committees.

SHEPAUG DRAMATICS: Students earned 12 nominations for the prestigious Seven Angels Theatre Halo Awards with one student taking home an award for Best Performance by a featured actress in a musical.

SHEPAUG ART AWARDS: Shepaug Valley School artists bloomed in the 2024 school year. Student work was celebrated at several juried events including the Annual Washington Art Association's Teen Expo, ASAP's Young Photographers Celebration and the Congressional Art show at Mattatuck Museum in Waterbury, CT. Select students were also included at the Scholastic Art Awards exhibition at Hartford Art School. Shepaug students were awarded the American Vision Award, Gold Key Winning Works and Honorable Mention.
