Dear Corbett Prep Parents and Community,

Our Spring Session of after-school enrichment programs begins on Monday, February 10, with more than 50 activities for all ages! Please look over this brochure to see the many options we have available for students to try new interests, pursue a passion, or develop their skills in a fun and friendly environment.

After-School Program FAQs

What is the difference between after-school programs and Extended Day? Extended Day provides childcare to Corbett Prep families daily until 5:45 p.m. and includes supervised recreation and homework time. Families can choose additional after-school programs for enrichment or skill development in sports, languages, the arts, STEAM, and recreational activities. All take place on the Corbett Prep campus, and most run for a half-hour to an hour. Families may sign up for Extended Day if they need care outside of those activity periods.

What programs are available? After-school programs fall into two categories – After-School Activities (ASA) and the Community School classes. After-school activities are open only to Corbett Prep students and provide a fun environment for learning, exploring, and playing. Community School Programs include the Community School of the Arts (CSA), Community School of Languages (CSL), and Community School for Sports (CSS). Students from any school may enroll in the Community School classes.

Who teaches classes? Instructors are Corbett Prep faculty members, alumni, and hand-selected vendors.

How do students get to and from their activities? After-school programs take place immediately after Corbett Prep dismissal, and teachers will walk their students to the classrooms. When the activity has concluded, students will go to Extended Day (separate registration) or wait for pickup at Station 2 in front of the Gatlin Hall gymnasium.

Community School programs have varying times and locations. Directors will communicate drop-off and pick-up locations with families once they have registered. The brochure lists whether the classes take place on Corbett Prep's elementary or middle school campus. Teachers will walk Corbett Prep students who are registered for Extended Day to and from their programs.
