#### **COST REQUIREMENTS Concurrent Enrollment**

- West-MEC pays the college tuition (in-state tuition only; out-of-state students are responsible for the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition) for students accepted to the EMT Program.
  - o \$15 registration fee per semester
  - o \$5.00 per clock hour due soon after classes begin OR \$97 per credit hour, along with class laboratory fees
    - Cost based upon meeting Maricopa residency and U.S. citizen/legal residency criteria (Must complete "Maricopa Community Colleges Student Declaration of Citizenship or Status" form. Visit <a href="https://www.maricopa.edu/residency">www.maricopa.edu/residency</a>)
    - Courses taken under concurrent enrollment may impact federal financial aid eligibility. To obtain additional information, students are encouraged to inquire with the college or university where they intend to enroll.
