Message From The Superintendent of Schools

Dear Ardsley Families,

This week offers a meaningful opportunity to reflect on and learn from the diversity and history that shape our world with two significant cultural observances—Holocaust Remembrance Day and Lunar New Year.

Today, January 27, we observe Holocaust Remembrance Day and the 80th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz. This solemn day serves as a reminder of the six million Jewish lives and countless others lost to the Holocaust. It is also a call to reflect on the importance of standing against hatred, discrimination and intolerance. I encourage families to engage in conversations about this history and its lasting lessons. <u>The United States Holocaust Memorial Museum</u> and the <u>Auschwitz-Birkenau Memorial and Museum</u> offer resources to support these discussions.

This week, we also celebrate Lunar New Year, the most important holiday in China and celebrated by millions of Asians worldwide, with each adding unique customs to the festivities. Rooted in centuries-old traditions, the holiday begins with the first new moon of the lunar calendar, celebrates the arrival of spring, and emphasizes family, renewal and hope.
