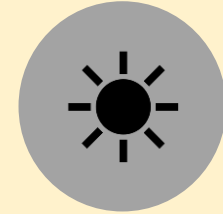

ATEC 204 - Automotive Suspension and Steering (Hours)

Automotive Suspension and Steering fundamentals including: Diagnosis, inspection, repair, and adjustment of modern automotive steering, suspension, supplemental restraint, tire pressure monitoring, and alignment systems, theory of operation, common automotive steering and suspension systems, wheel alignment principles, methods of diagnosis, adjustment and repair, suspension service equipment. This course is free and students may repeat this course until mastery of the skills is met. This course is a noncredit course that is equivalent to the ATEC credit course of the same title. Both options cover the same content and students will be enrolled in the same class at the same time. If a student chooses to move from noncredit to credit courses, please meet with ATEC faculty to discuss assessing equivalency and credit by exam. This course is part of a Certificate of Completion. SB 554 – Public Schools: Adult School Students Advanced Scholastic and Vocational Training Program

Authorizes the governing board of a school district and a community college to permit student pursuing a high school diploma or a high school equivalency certificate to enroll as a special part-time student at a community college
