WEIGHTED GRADES

Weighted courses represent the most rigorous learning standards and content requiring the highest level of student performance and time commitment. The weighted grading system is used to determine academic student honors and distinctions.

The weighted grade formula is figured by using the standard grade point average and adding weighted value. The weighted value is computed by taking the number of weighted courses and dividing it by the number of semesters multiplied by seven: $\text{Weighted GPA} = (\text{GPA}) + (\# \text{ of Weighted Courses with grades of A, B, or C}) / 7(\# \text{ of semesters})$.

A weighted grade can be attained for the courses below by achieving class grades of A, B, or C. All courses on the list below have an equal weighted grade value:



