Director of Student Services Amanda Hargan presented her report.

#### **Special Education Overview**

Freeburg 70 serves a total of 136 students (18%) in special education, exceeding the state average of 15% (2023). This includes:

- 71 students with IEPs in grades K-8.
- 13 students in specialized programs outside the district.
- 39 speech-only IEPs.
- 13 early childhood students, with one in a specialized program.

The district emphasizes providing the least restrictive environment, allowing students to spend more time in general education settings. This shift has resulted in improved outcomes, as reflected in benchmark assessment growth.

#### 504 Plans

Currently, 33 students (5%) have 504 plans. The number has increased this semester, and teams are refining accommodations to ensure these plans are both effective and manageable.

#### **Response to Intervention / MTSS**

Winter benchmarking shows overall improvement in student scores for reading and math, with multiple grade levels meeting the goal of 80% scoring above the 25th percentile:

- **Reading**: 2 grade levels meet the goal, with 5 more close behind.
- **Math**: 7 grade levels already meet the goal.

Progress is monitored using trends across multiple data points to guide curriculum adjustments and interventions, supporting continuous student growth.

#### **Additional Highlights**

- Attendance rate remains strong at 95% or higher.
- Behavior referrals have significantly decreased at the Elementary level compared to last year.
