A Message from Superintendent Seth Lipshie

The school year is well underway as students have adjusted to their new routines and continue to explore opportunities as we move into the winter. Extra-curricular activities are available, and we witnessed one of the most successful fall sports seasons in recent memory. Students had a successful winter concert season. We have had some amazing activities taking place in our classes that can be seen on our Facebook page.

I wanted to take this opportunity to share an update on the Miller Place UFSD Five-Year Strategic Plan. At the November 20th Board of Education meeting, I presented a comprehensive update, which can be found on the District's website under the Strategic Plan page. The update includes activities and actions related to each of the plan's Pillars and outlines next steps in the process. Below are some results from that presentation comparing pre-strategic plan data from 2022 to 2024:

COURSES AND EXAMS	RESULTS AND ENROLLMENT
10 Regents Exams Administered	Passing rate increased in 8 of the 10 exams. One exam remained flat.
10 Regents Exams Administered	Mastery rate increased by more than 10% in 7 of the 10 exams.
Advanced Placement Courses	Enrollment increased by 16%.
College Bearing Courses	Scores improved by 16%. Enrollment increased by 70%.

In a survey given to students in grades 8 through 12, the percentage of respondents providing a perspective who agreed with each survey statement (excluding neutral respondents) resulted as follows:

Grading practices are clearly articulated.	86%
Most of my classes are challenging me to be a better student.	85%
Students in grades 10 through 12, Miller Place offers elective courses that are most helpful to my educational future.	71%



AROUND OUR SCHOOLS

ANDREW MULLER PRIMARY SCHOOL

At **Andrew Muller Primary School**, we are enhancing our science curriculum with Mystery Science to further engage students in hands-on learning.

In kindergarten, students are studying weather and its impact on our seasons and environment. They are learning how weather affects the color change in leaves and will soon explore extreme weather events. First grade students are exploring the moon and stars, discussing seasonal changes in daylight and how the sun rises in the east and sets in the west. Second grade students are focused on the Properties of Matter. Students are learning to classify materials as conductors or insulators through experiments, such as designing hats for different climates using various materials.

Mystery Science is making learning exciting and impactful for our students!





LADDIE A. DECKER SOUND BEACH SCHOOL

In Grade 4 science, **Laddie A. Decker Sound Beach School** students took part in a lesson named "A Walk in the Park," a special unit focused on ecosystems. Over two days, each class took an investigative walk to the Miller Place Duck Pond, examining its ecosystem and engaging in hands-on learning.

During a scavenger hunt, students identified plants and animals living in the pond, noting the sounds and species present. They explored the roles of producers, consumers, and decomposers, and learned how species interact in a pond environment. This experience deepened their understanding of ecosystems and the importance of preserving natural habitats.

The lesson connected to their grade 4 social studies unit on geography and resources, where students used their knowledge of local geography and mapping to compare their community with other regions in the state.

NORTH COUNTRY ROAD MIDDLE SCHOOL

On November 8, **North Country Road Middle School** had the privilege of hosting Master Sergeant Jackowski as a special guest speaker in Ms. DeRosa's class. During his visit, Master Sergeant Jackowski shared his personal experiences and insights from his time in the military, offering students a meaningful perspective on service and sacrifice. His presentation inspired and engaged the students, encouraging them to reflect on the importance of Veterans Day. Thank you, Mr. Jackowski, for your service and for inspiring our students!

Celebrating Student Art: Miller Place's Rising Stars

In the recent NYSATA Region #10 exhibition, three students stood out for their creativity and skill across various mediums. Amelia Avalos, an 11th grader, presented *Scarab Zentangle*, a detailed black pen design that blends the precision of a scarab beetle with the calming patterns of zentangle. Her piece demonstrates a keen ability to create depth and texture. Fellow 11th grader Sabrina Schafer showcased *Still Life*, an exquisite graphite and Prismacolor pencil drawing. Through careful shading, Sabrina brought everyday objects to life, masterfully capturing light and shadow.
