<b>College Admissions Requirements</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>English: 4.0 credits</li> <li>Mathematics: 3.0-4.0 credits (minimum through Algebra 2, math also required during senior year for college admissions)</li> <li>Science: 3.0-4.0 credits (students must complete at least 1.0 credit of algebra-based science)</li> <li>Social Studies: 3.0-4.0 credits</li> <li>The Arts: Check with your specific college, as some require 2 one- semester courses from the same discipline i.e., visual or performing arts</li> <li>World Language: 2.0 credits minimum (must be 2.0 credits of the same language for college admission) OR 2.0 credits PPR*</li> </ul>
<b>Personalized Pathway Requirements (PPR)</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>*PPR=Personalized Pathway Requirements: Courses that lead to a specific post-high school career outcome chosen by the student, based on the student's interest and High School and Beyond Plan. PPR course be an extra credit of Art, two credits of World Language, two credits of CTE, or credits in another subject area focused in the student's area of interest.</li> </ul>
