

# Diploma Requirements for Graduation

The following subject areas and credits are required for graduation.

\*PPR=Personalized Pathway Requirements: courses that lead to a specific post-high school career outcome chosen by the student, based on the student's interests and High School and Beyond Plan (HSBP).

- English: 4.0 credits of English/Language Arts
- Mathematics: 3.0 credits:
  - 1.0 Algebra 1
  - 1.0 Geometry
  - 1.0 3<sup>rd</sup> credit of math chosen by the student based on the student's interest and High School and Beyond Plan
- Science: 3.0 credits:
  - 3.0 credits of science
    - Includes 1.0 credits of 9<sup>th</sup> grade required Biology course.
- Social Studies: 3.0 credits
  - 1.0 credits of World History/AP World History
  - 1.0 US History/AP US History
  - 1.0 Senior History Equivalents: 0.5 credits in Contemporary World Issues and 0.5 credits of Civics/AP Gov Pol/College in the High School Global Studies.
- Health and Fitness: 2.0 credits
  - 1.5 credits in Physical Education
  - 0.5 credits in Health
- Career and Technical Education (CTE) 1.0 credits that meets CTE exploration requirements or higher.
- The Arts: 1.0 credit to be met in visual and/or performing arts.
- Electives: 7.0 credits
  - 3.0 PPR + 4.0 Elective choices
- World Language: 2.0 credits
  - Must be of the same language for 4-year college applicants
  - Options for PPR if not attending 4-year university post high school.

Successfully complete two courses in any combination of College in the High School, CTE Dual Credit (formerly known as Tech Prep) AP, and/or Running Start, unless an alternative course of study is identified through the students HSBP.

One semester in Washington State History must be met in the 7<sup>th</sup> grade as a non-credit bearing high school course.

Complete the High School and Beyond Plan through Xello.

Meet all state high school assessment requirements, met through SBAC or the Grad Pathways Options.
