“Cardinal Gibbons Athletic Hall of Fame” was formed for the purpose of recognizing and honoring those student-athletes, coaches, teams, administrators and special individuals who have made an outstanding contribution and/or offered extraordinary service to Cardinal Gibbons Athletics. The following criteria are considered when making inductee selections.

1. Nominations are based on the following categories: athlete, coach, team, administrator or special individuals.
2. Athletes must have graduated 10 years before an individual or team can be considered.
3. An athlete must have lettered in at least one varsity sport.
4. An individual (if not selected posthumously) must be present to accept the award, unless unforeseen circumstances prevent him/her from attending. Without these unforeseen circumstances a nominee has only 3 years to be present to be inducted.
5. If there is a tie in the nominations the earlier graduate will be chosen.
6. An individual may be nominated for more than one category at one time and may be inducted as an individual and team in the same or different classes.
7. An equal number of male and female athletes are strongly suggested.
8. Recommendation forms and nominee information must meet all deadlines to be eligible for consideration.
9. Anyone in the Hall of Fame may nominate a person or team who the individual feels is worthy and meets the above criteria. However, if you are not a Hall of Fame member, you must do so through a current Hall of Fame member. It will be the Cardinal Gibbons Hall of Fame member's responsibility to fill out the nomination form, thereby verifying, endorsing the credentials, qualifications and character of this nominee. All nominations must be presented to the Board with facts to back up the reasons why this person should be a member of the Hall of Fame. All information on eligible candidates will be presented to the Board. The Board, in turn by vote, will choose the candidates for the respective year.
10. The Hall of Fame Committee consists of the Selection Committee Members and all inducted members.



ANA ZAMBONI GREW UP IN

the world of competitive swim; her mom was a gold and silver medalist at the 1968 Mexico City Olympics. Ana began competing at the age of 10 and by the age of 13 had the 5th best time in the world in the 200 breaststroke. Ana was a two-time silver medalist at the European Juniors in Rome and a finalist in the 200 medley at the 1988 Seoul Olympics. Ana also won the World medley in the 400 in Bonn. Ana

moved to Fort Lauderdale and trained at the Swimming Hall of Fame. While attending Cardinal Gibbons, Ana won two FHSAA State titles in the 500 Free and the 200 IM. Ana continued to compete internationally, reaching the finals of the 400 medley at the World Championships in Perth, Australia.

In 1992, Ana retired from competition and returned to Locarno. With her mom's help, Ana opened a swimming and water fitness school, where she continues to coach to this day. Ana has now had the opportunity to pass on her enthusiasm and showing the beauty of her discipline to her two children, Tristan and Taryn, who follow Ana around the pool incessantly during swimming lessons.



MARK MOYANO WAS A standout athlete at Cardinal Gibbons, earning three varsity baseball letters. In his senior year, he was named to the 1994 1st Team All-State as an outfielder and to the Florida Sports Writers Association Baseball Team. He was also selected to the Second Team All-Broward County for all 5A-4A-3A schools and the Broward County Senior North All-Star Team. Mark finished second in Broward County with 35 runs

scored. After graduation, he was offered a baseball scholarship to Butler University but chose to walk on at Florida Atlantic University. Unfortunately, an injury ended his college baseball dreams, but he shifted his focus to academics at the University of Florida.

Mark later returned to Fort Lauderdale to coach, including assisting with Cardinal Gibbons' JV baseball team and coaching AAU teams. He also coached softball and tee ball for his children in Little League. Mark passed away from gastric adenocarcinoma on September 26, 2016, but his memory lives on through his family, friends, and Cardinal Gibbons. His passion for baseball, education, faith, and family are his lasting legacies, especially his children Mia (CG '26), Morgan (CG '28), and Mark (future CG '30), who proudly carry on the Gibbons tradition.

Rodolfo “Rudy” Rake ‘97



RODOLFO “RUDY” RAKE IS

one of the most accomplished athletes to graduate from Cardinal Gibbons High School. A key player on the 1994, 1995, and 1997 tennis teams, he led his team to state titles in 1995 and 1997, and won the 1997 individual singles title. That year, Rudy competed in the U.S. Open main draw, ranked #1 in the USTA 18s junior division, and was #4 in the ITF world junior rankings, with wins over James Blake and Roger

Federer. At the University of Miami, he played #1 singles as a freshman in 1998, earning a top-25 NCAA ranking and representing the Hurricanes at the NCAA Championships. Rudy competed professionally from 1998 to 2001, achieving an ATP world ranking of 350. After retiring from tennis, he graduated Summa Cum Laude with a Finance degree from Florida Atlantic University and a 3.96 GPA. He then built a 16-year finance career with Smith Barney and Morgan Stanley, becoming one of the youngest Managing Directors in Wealth Management at 32. In 2021, he co-founded Diagonal Investment Office, a growing multi-family office serving high-net-worth clients across Latam and the U.S. Now based in Key Biscayne, Rudy enjoys family life with his wife, Melissa, and their three sons: Vasco (12), Joaquin (10), and Thiago (6).

Joelle won in doubles her freshman year, she won in both doubles and singles her sophomore year and again in doubles her junior and senior year. Joelle was named the FH-SAA Dairy Farmers Player of the Year in 2001 and she was also the Sun-Sentinel Broward Player of the Year in 2002 and a two time Miami Herald Broward Player

of the Year.. Over her four year career Joelle was named a National High School All American all four years. Joelle was also part of four consecutive State Tennis Championships for the Girls team. Upon leaving as the winningest tennis player in Cardinal Gibbons history, Joelle continued her tennis career at the University of Kentucky.



WHEN NICK WILLIAMS

walked into the gym for Boys Volleyball tryouts as a freshman, Coach Marcy Meyer knew he was going to ‘something special’. As a starter his sophomore year, Nick was quickly earning a reputation in the volleyball community with his relentless style of play, earning Sun-Sentinel Honorable Mention. Nick’s Junior year proved to be even better; being name First team All-County in both the Miami

Herald and the Sun-Sentinel, and leading the State with 375 kills. While a tragic accident cut short Nick’s athletic career, he has become an even more impressive role model to the students at Cardinal Gibbons for his perseverance and incredible courage in the face of adversity all the while keeping his faith and optimistic view of life.



MACY HUSKEY GRADUATED

in 2011 as the most decorated medalist in Cardinal Gibbons history. Macy took the stand at the FHSAA podium eight times; including six at Track, and one each in soccer and cross country. Along the way, Macy also picked up several local honors. She was a two-time Broward County Female Athlete of the Year, Sun-Sentinel and Miami Herald Runner of the Year, first team All-County for

Cross Country three times, first Team All-County twice in track and First Team All-County in soccer. Macy holds countless Cardinal Gibbons running records and was team Captain for both Cross Country and Track. Macy went on to continue her success in cross country and track at The University of Florida. Macy competed at the SEC and NCAA Regional Championships in Cross Country and was a finalist in the SEC Outdoor Track and Field meet.



TODD FABER RETIRED FROM

Coaching in 1999, but he left quite a legacy. Coaching the Cardinal Gibbons Girls Basketball team to over 200 wins, two District titles, two Regional titles and two trips to the FHSAA Girls Basketball Finals. More important than his wins and championships, Coach Faber empowered his student-athletes to be confident, strong leaders who continue to model those character traits and skills developed

under his mentorship. Todd's teams won over 20 games five times in 13 years! Todd never stopped being a coach, as a Dad and husband, Todd watched countless Cardinal Gibbons volleyball, basketball and football games, always thinking in his head what he would do if he were coaching.




TOM BUTLER GREW UP

around the corner from Cardinal Gibbons High School in a house that would see all six Butler siblings graduate from Gibbons. Tom ran around the Coral Ridge neighborhood, forging friendships that would last a lifetime. Tom played football, basketball and baseball at Gibbons, but what he really did was develop a love for his school, his fellow classmates and the traditions surrounding

St. Anthony's, St. John's and Cardinal Gibbons. After college, Tom entered the hospitality industry before settling in with brother John at Bodax Foundations. Tom's love for Cardinal Gibbons never wavered, as he became a fervent supporter of Gibbons Athletics, the Annual Golf Tournament and the football program. Aside from annual contribution to the aforementioned, Tom also spent 15 years as chairperson for the Alumni Golf Tournament; spending endless hours of his spare time coordinating, planning and executing the event.
