Endorsements

Endorsements consist of a related series of courses that are grouped together by interest or skill set.

- Multi-Disciplinary
- STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics)
- Arts and Humanities
- Business and Industries
- Public Service

Note: Students are automatically placed on the Multi-Disciplinary

Plan. Students must earn at least one endorsement to graduate

GPA Calculation

Grade Point Average (GPA)

- Calculated by averaging each semester grade earned in a class
- Reported on a weighted 100 point scale
- Some courses are weighted
 - AP courses receive 10 additional points
 - Many courses labeled advanced/honors receive 7 additional points

Courses excluded from GPA Calculations:

- High school credits earned in middle school (exception: Spanish)
- Online correspondence courses and CBE
- Dual Credit
- Credit Recovery courses
- Pass/Fail credits



Class Rank

Carroll Senior High School is a non-ranking high school. We only rank students in the top 10% for the purpose of automatic admission to Texas public colleges.

No other students are ranked. If you are ranked, it will be posted at the bottom of your transcript.



Automatic Admissions

Texas seniors ranked in the top 10% of their class are automatically admitted to Texas public universities (top 5% at UT Austin).

Being in the top 10% is NOT the only way to get into a Texas public college or university.

Remember, 90% of your peers are NOT in the top 10%!



Course Offerings



On-Level vs Advanced/Honors vs AP

- Pace of instruction
- Depth of study
- Volume of homework
- Reading
- Writing
- Level of teacher guidance
- Expectation of organization, maturity and self-direction

Tip: Talk to your current teachers for level recommendations!



Advanced Placement (AP) Courses

What makes an AP class different?

- AP classes build stronger critical thinking and writing skills
- College-level courses and expectations
- Possibility to earn college credit by earning 3+ on an AP Exam (1-5 scale)
 - Passing standard and credit awarded is determined by each college

What will help you be successful?

- Problem solving/analytical skills
- Time management skills
- Well-developed oral and written communication skills
- Reading (on or above grade level) for comprehension, analysis, and interpretation
- A strong work ethic
- Self motivation and initiative
- Post-secondary educational goals



Dual Credit (11th and 12th only)

- Dual Credit allows a high school junior or senior to enroll in a college course and receive simultaneous academic credit for the course from both the college and the high school.
- Juniors may enroll in Govt, Econ, and Public Speaking.
- Dual Credit English is reserved for seniors only and is double blocked.
- Students must have qualifying ACT, SAT, or TSI score to enroll in a Dual Credit course.

Elective Course Options

Examples:

- 3rd year+ of LOTE
- 2nd year+ of Fine Art or Athletics
- 5th+ math and science
- CTE courses
- General electives

Anything you take beyond a graduation requirement is an elective.

Balance is Key!

There is no magic number of Advanced or AP courses you should take!

- Make authentic choices
 - Pursue your interests or potential interests
- Consider other activities you prioritize
 - Family, social, and religious activities
 - Extra-curricular activities
 - Time to rest and recharge
- Consult with parents and current teachers on the appropriate level course for you



How Many Classes Do I Choose?

Juniors and **Seniors** need at least 6 classes and up to 2 off blocks

- May have one off block per day (if credits allow)
 - If you are planning to take 2 off periods, you will need to enter it twice
- Off-blocks can be 1st, 5th, 4th, or 8th only
 - IMPORTANT- if you choose to take off-blocks, be sure you are utilizing your free time productively
 - Off blocks are not guaranteed

Remember: some classes (athletics, certain bands) are "double-blocked" and meet on both A and B days, accounting for 2 total blocks.



Pay Attention to Prerequisites!

Some classes have <u>prerequisites</u> or <u>grade-level restrictions</u> – you cannot register for a course if you haven't met them.

- Ex: To be in AP Physics, you must be concurrently enrolled in Pre-Calculus (or have already earned Pre-Calc credit)
- Ex: Principles of Business Marketing and Finance must be taken before Entrepreneurship

Please be sure you have met any prerequisite requirements prior to selecting a course by looking it up in the Academic Planning Guide.


Course Request Process for Rising 11th-12th Grade

Log into Skyward Student Access (Parent login will not work!)

Enter your <u>Course Requests</u> (Go to Schedule > View Requests to begin.) <u>These requests will be used to build your schedule for the upcoming school year.</u>



Enter Course Requests




Click "Schedule" in the left-side menu.

If CHS and CSHS display, select "View Requests" for the campus you will be attending next school year.

Make sure the school you will attend next school year is the campus listed. (Rising 10th graders should select CHS, and rising 11th graders should select CSHS.)



Highlight/click on the course you wish to take, and then click "Add Course," which will move that course from "Available Courses" to "Selected Courses."
