EXTRA-CURRICULAR BUS PROCEDURES

In order for a parent to get his/her child off the extracurricular bus, the parent must, in writing, tell the coach/advisor that he/she is taking the child off the bus and assuming responsibility for the child. School personnel do not have the authority to allow a child to go home with another adult, even with a written note from the child's parent. If you are not going to be attending the extracurricular activity and plan to have your child ride home with another adult, please make arrangements with Mr. Olson prior to the departure time from the school for the activity. If the activity is on a Friday or Saturday, arrangements should be made by the end of the day Thursday so information can be passed along to the coaches. We have this procedure in place as the District is liable for every student from the time our buses leave Custer School until the time they return to the school.

WINTER WEATHER

With winter weather here, it is important that children dress appropriately. Your elementary students need to be well prepared to fight the cold with warm clothing because their small bodies lose heat quickly. When your children are leaving home, make sure they are aware of what should be taken to counter the cold weather. If snow is on the ground, elementary students should be wearing snow boots, gloves and hats. If it is just cold out, the boots are optional. Also, please remind your students riding the bus, whether extracurricular or route, that they should be prepared for cold winter conditions. If they choose not to wear the proper clothing, they should at least have it with them in case of an emergency.


