





Dual Enrollment and High School Credits

A semester dual enrollment class = 1 full high school credit

Example:

Student A takes ENG 1101 for one semester.

This will count as a full 1.0 English credit to meet their graduation requirement

A student does not need ENG 1101 AND ENG 1102 to meet the high school graduation requirement.



Work-Based Learning (WBL)	Talented and Gifted (TAG) Career Internship Program	Peer Facilitation
<p>What is it? WBL is a course serving as the extension of the student's work in their college and career pathway. It can take the form of in-person or virtual internships and clinical experiences.</p>	<p>What is it? The Gifted Career Internship Program is designed to provide Talented and Gifted (TAG) students the opportunity to explore potential career interests by working with professionals in the community.</p>	<p>What is it? Peer Facilitation is the opportunity for students to work on campus and alongside staff members in the building including both office settings or classroom settings.</p>
<p>Eligibility: Rising 11th and 12th grade students. Students must be at least 16 years old. The only unacceptable jobs are babysitting or nannying.</p>	<p>Eligibility: Rising 11th and 12th grade students identified as TAG students in good standing. Students must have an unweighted GPA of 90 or higher.</p>	<p>Eligibility: Rising 11th and 12th grade students who are in good standing with their academics and behavior.</p>
<p>Length of enrollment: Students in WBL are enrolled for a full year. It is part of their schedule. Students can take up to 3 periods of WBL; each period is 5 hours work per week up to 15 hours.</p>	<p>Length of enrollment: It is a semester-long class during the intern is paired with a mentor for 5-10 hours a week. Students are encouraged to explore a different field each semester and for up to 4 semesters.</p>	<p>Length of Enrollment: Students are enrolled for a full year as a peer facilitator.</p>

TAG Directed Study

- Directed Study is an outstanding option for the self-guided learner!
- Elective credit that receives a numerical grade
- Each directed study is guided by a contract developed by the student alongside of a TAG teacher
- The developed contract includes standards, at least 12 gradable experiences, percentage of course grade assigned to each experience, and due dates.
- Great chance for a student to explore their passions or continue a research project

Creating a Balanced Schedule

- Crafting a balanced schedule that meets the academic needs while considering individual responsibilities outside of school

Graduation Requirements

- Each year, students are responsible for ensuring they are working towards their graduation requirements.

Course Availability

- IA is intimately designed to ensure that all students have the opportunity to engage in a rich learning environment. Faculty are intentionally hired and placed based on student course selections. Course availability will be based on student feedback. Therefore, there is minimal schedule mobility/changes during the school year.

Protocols and Procedures of Scheduling

- Specific directions are sent out for each stage of scheduling
 - These do not include calls and emails as it delays the processing of the requests
- We are scheduling 1500 students in a two month span
- Students and parents are encouraged to use the provided resources on the scheduling website to make the most informed decision for their student
 - This includes the conversations that students have with their individual teachers about recommendations

Teachers recommend students for their next course based on numerous factors



Course Waivers

If a student is not recommended, they may meet with their current teacher to complete a waiver



Rigor Considerations


Ensure you calculate the workload hours that your child is signing up for. Above 21 hours is excessive!
