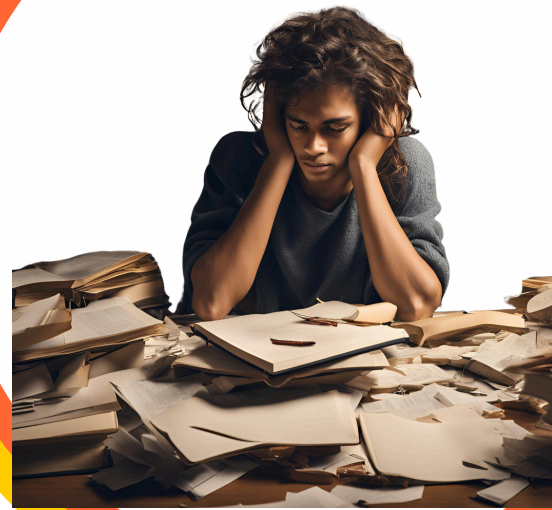


# EXCEPTIONAL STUDENTS ASYNCHRONOUS DEVELOPMENT
