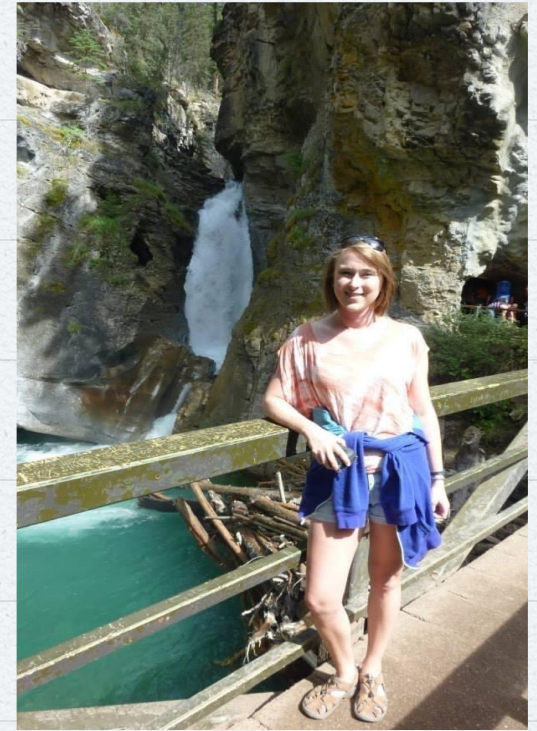

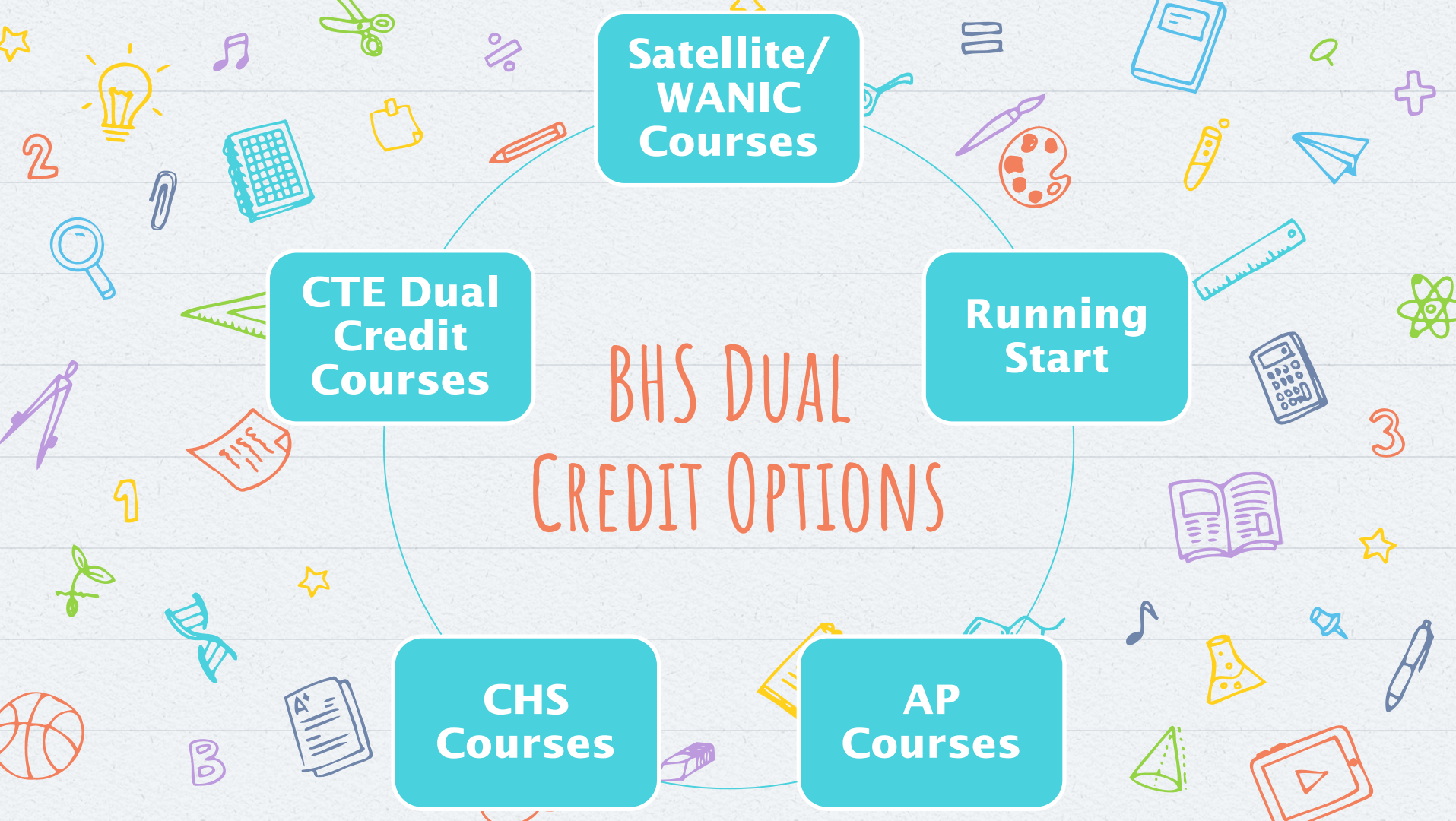

- ✕ Earn college credit for eligible CTE classes
- ✕ Steps to Earn CTE Dual Credit:
  - ✕ Enroll in an eligible CTE, WANIC or Satellite class
  - ✕ Earn a B grade or above (B average for a yearlong class)
  - ✕ Register and pay for the credit (\$50) during the same school year you take the class (June 15 deadline)
- ✕ Financial Assistance/Fee Waivers available




