Entrepreneurship was also discussed, as the company founder, Mr. Frank Robinson, began designing and building a helicopter in his garage in Palos Verdes before founding the company in 1973.






For the Long Beach area, the process begins when teachers in the Long Beach Unified School District submit the names of families facing difficulties. These families are contacted and additional information about them is gathered.
