ART CORNER

Students across multiple grade levels have been embracing their creativity with a variety of winter-themed art projects!

Pre-K created snowmen by working on their cutting skills. Kindergarteners used tracers and patterns for their snowmen. Our first graders looked through food magazines to make their snowmen.

In second grade, the students made polar bears with matching hats and scarves. The third graders used paper lids and felt to make 3-D snowmen that stand. Fourth graders studied and drew owls in tree branches with details. The fifth graders used charcoal pencils on light gray paper to create a winter scene at night with a light source.

Sixth graders learned about Vincent van Gogh and his famous painting, "Starry Night." Their project was to create a winter-themed artwork in van Gogh's style. The seventh graders finished a relaxing project, a "mindful" drawing that included line, shape, and color.

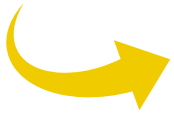

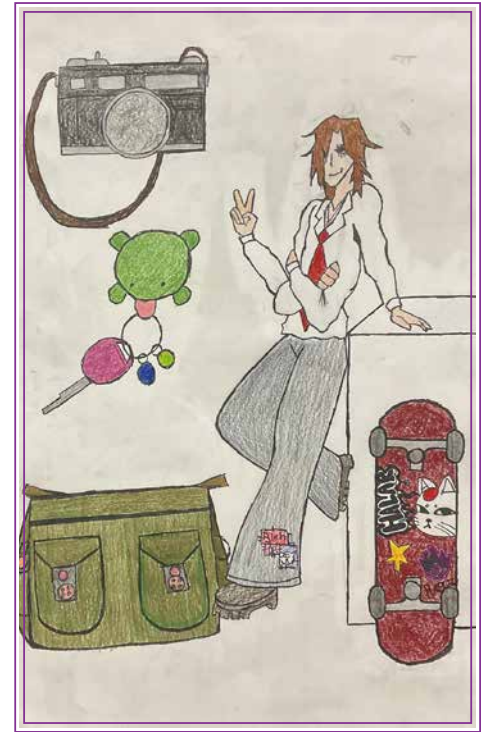
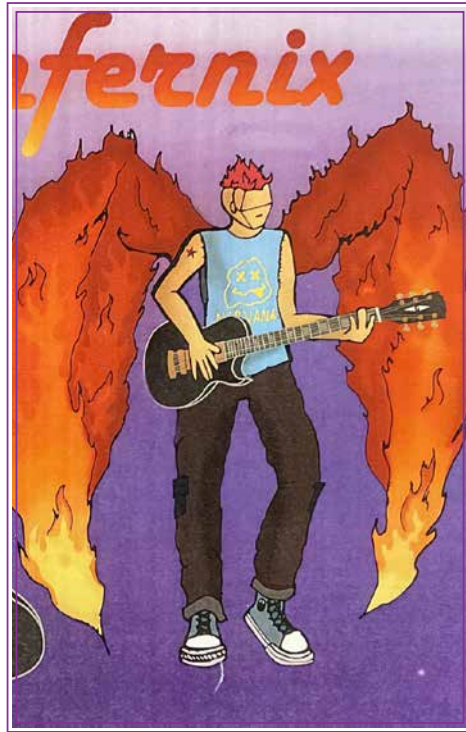
