- Full-time Running Start enrollment continues to rise



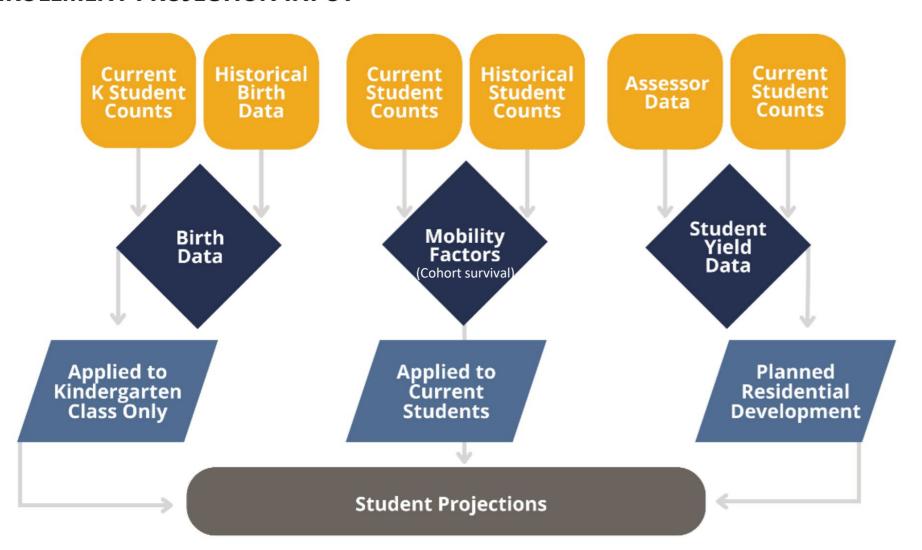
### "Bullish" Enrollment Factors

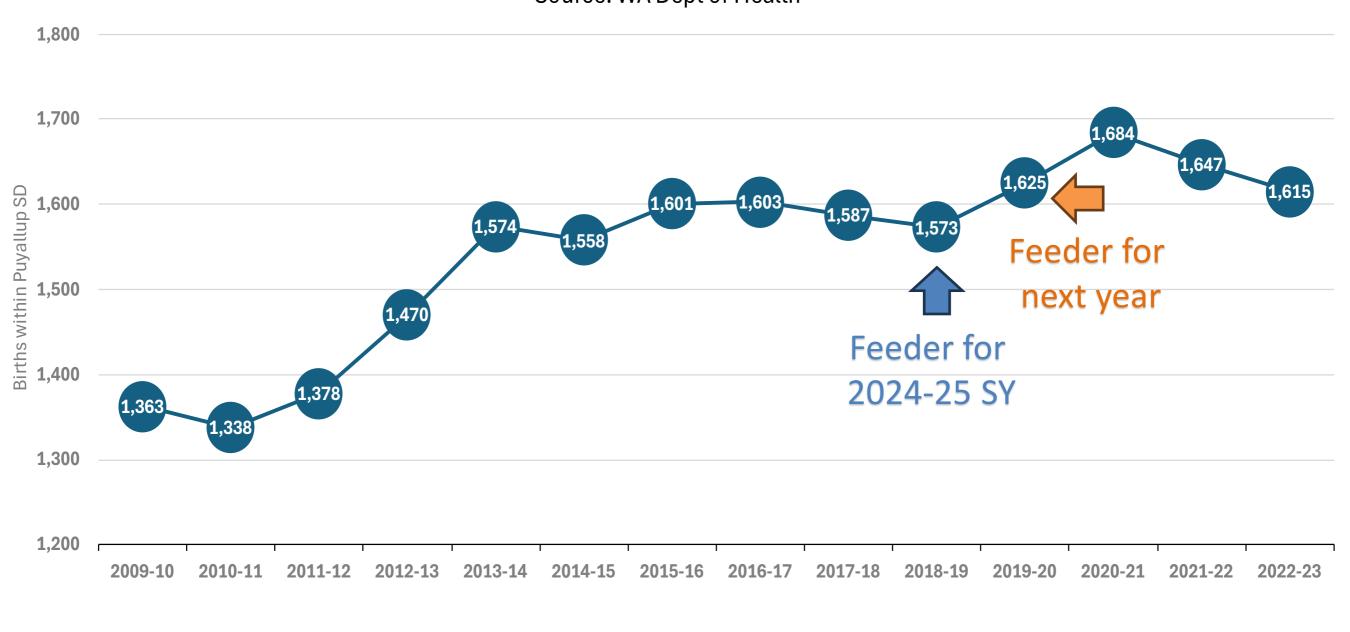

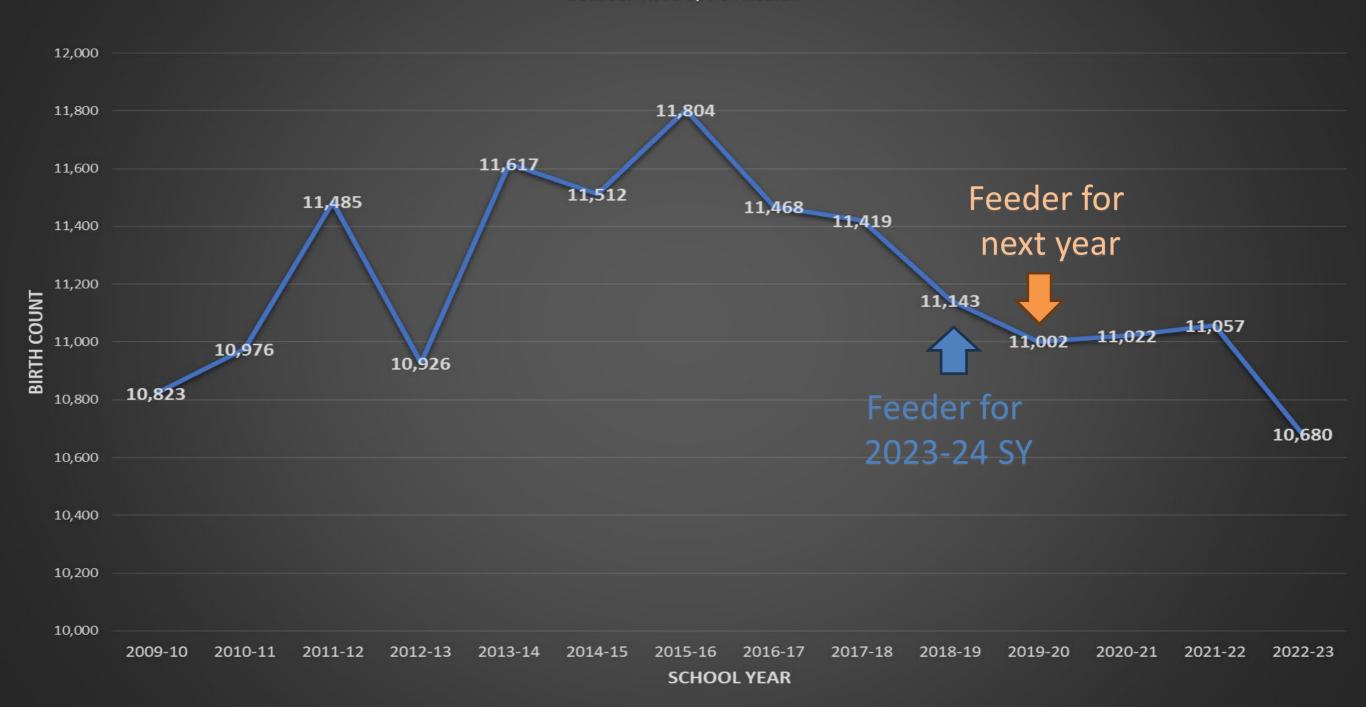
### Puyallup School District Area Births by School Year

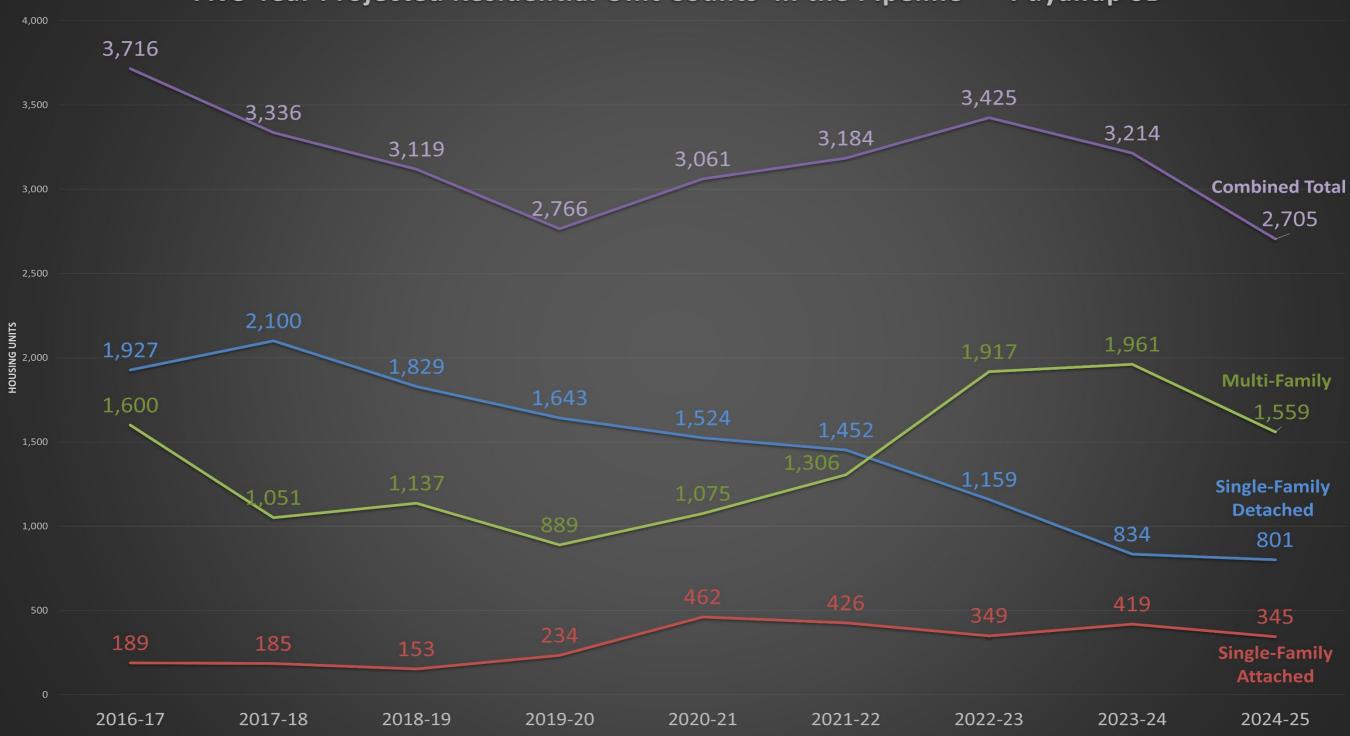

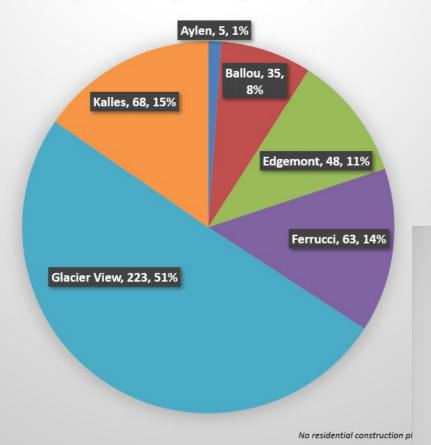

Five-Year Projected Residential Unit Counts 'in the Pipeline" - Puyallup SD

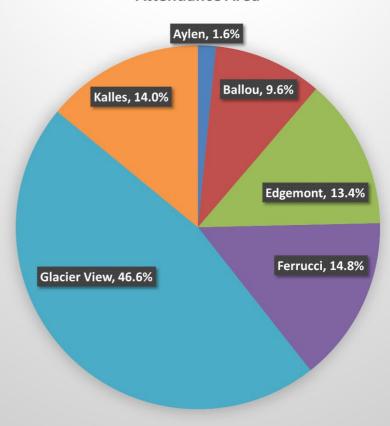


2024-25 (1-Yr) Total Projected Housing Units by Junior High School Attendance Area



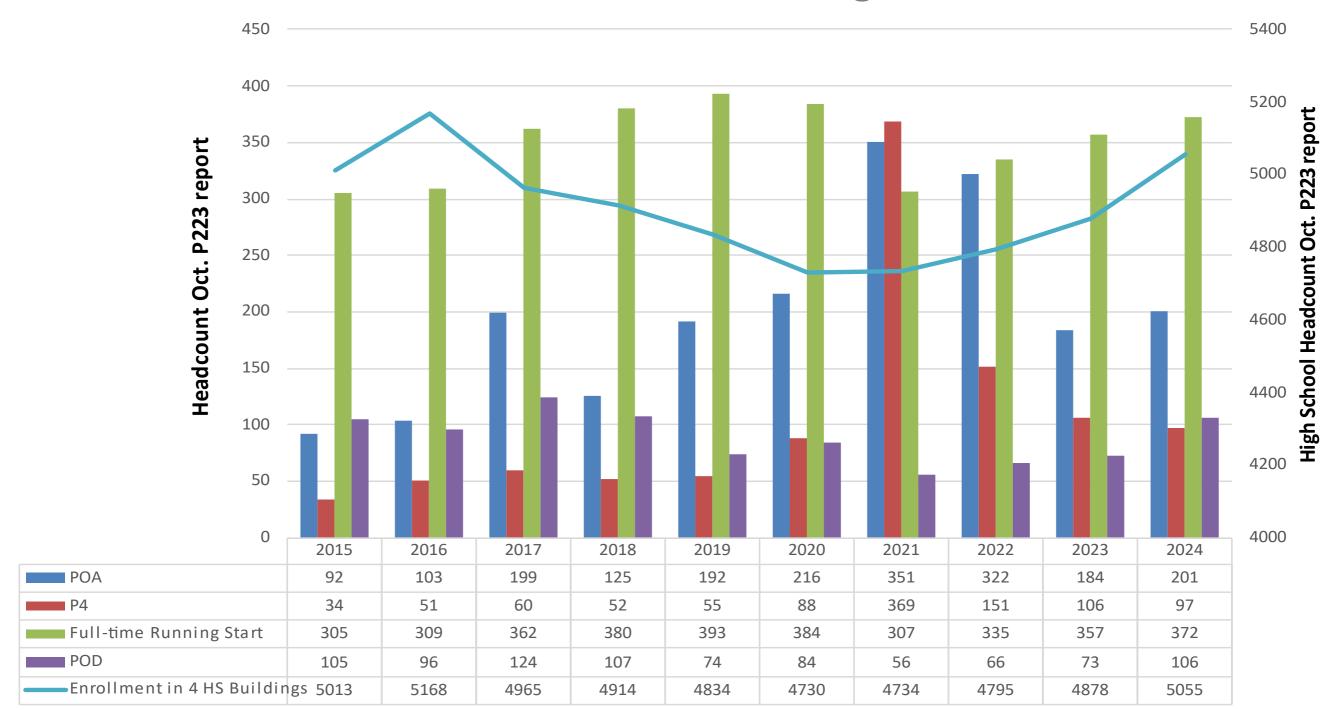


2024-25 (1-Yr) New Housing Weighted Student Generation % by Junior High School Attendance Area

     View to Northwood Elementary at the time QUEST is relocated.

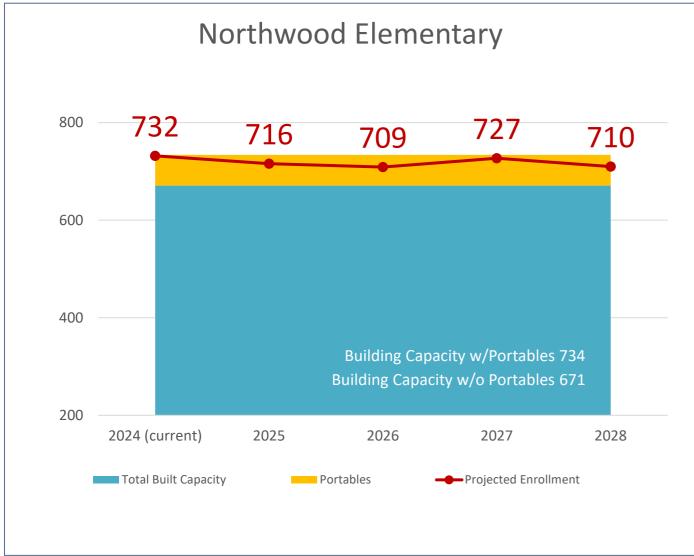






# October 2024 and Projected Enrollment Northwood Elementary

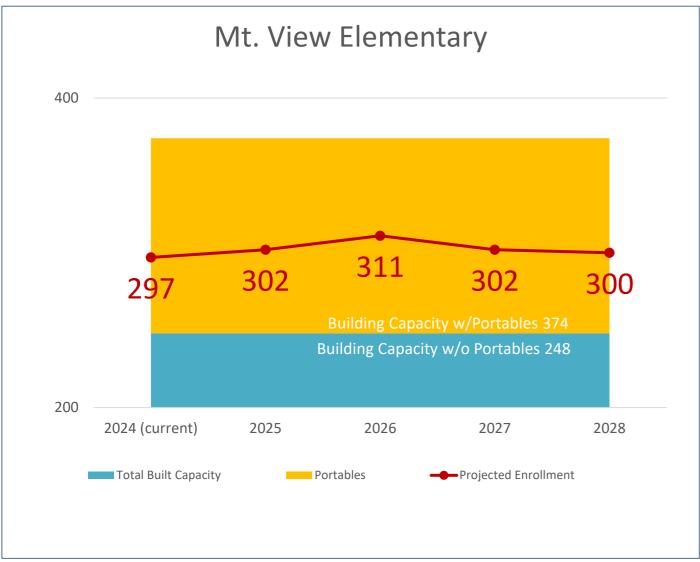

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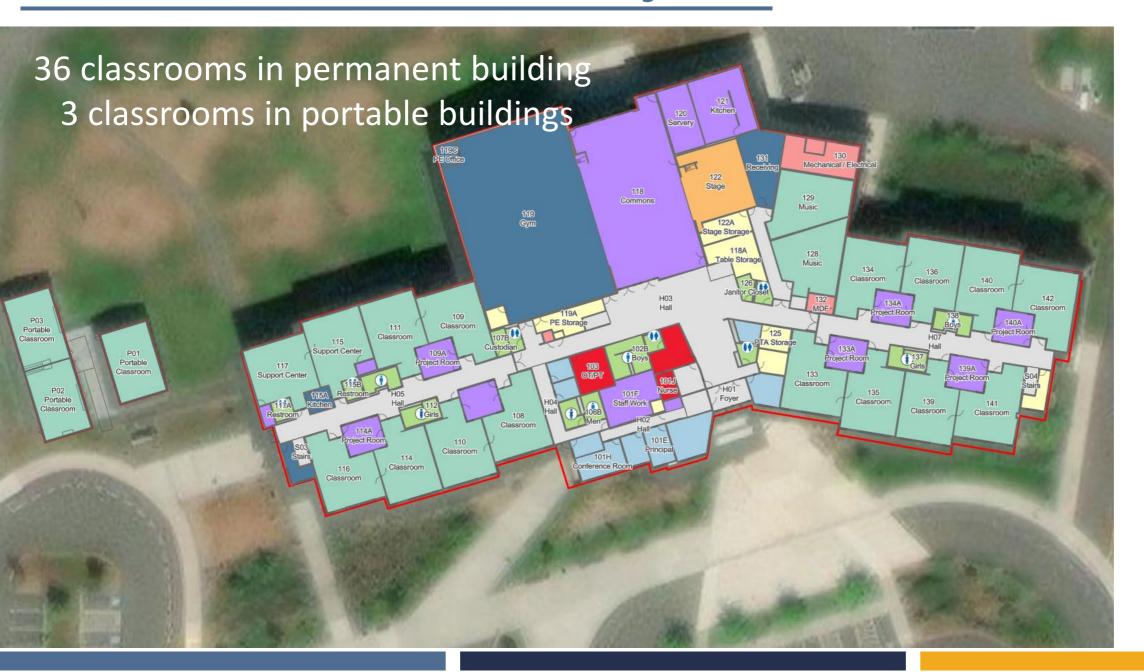




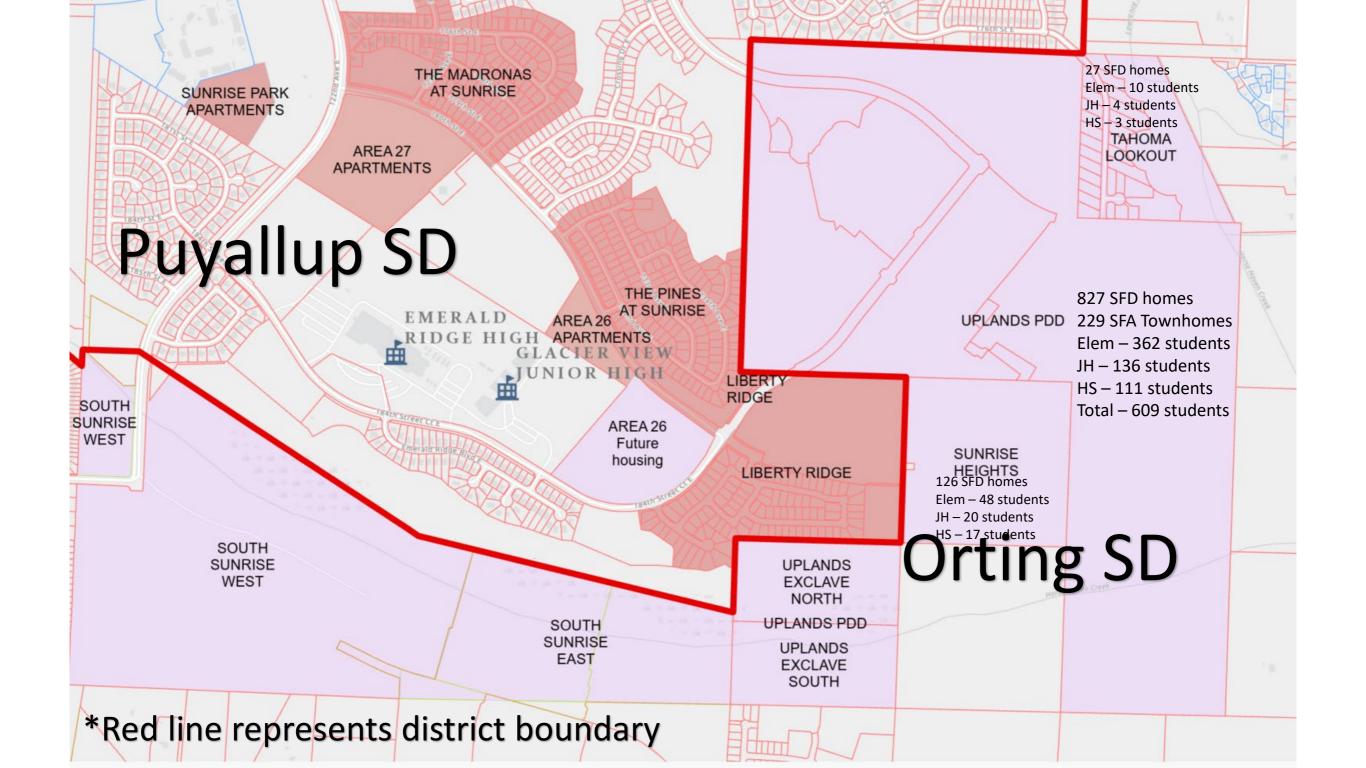

### **Bonds Build Schools**

As Puyallup continues to grow, **Propositionre** presents an important investment in our schools, ensuring that facilities meet the needs of both current and future students. Through thoughtful planning and a commitment to maintaining tax stability, Proposition 1 addresses growth and aging facilities.

Proposition 1 includes seven major projects:

- Expand Emerald Ridge, Puyallup, and Rogers High Schools to address overcrowding.
- Replace Mt. View, Spinning, and Waller Road Elementary Schools to improve aging facilities.
- Build a **new elementary** school in the Sunrise Master Plan area to support the district's projected growth.

### Potential State Match Projects

Many school districts can qualify for additional financial assistance from the state of Washington to help build or modernize facilities. The state determines the amount of square footage each student needs (the amounts are different for elementary, middle, and high schools) and assigns a dollar amount per square foot based on current average construction cost estimates.

Both new construction and remodeling projects can be eligible for state assistance. While these matching funds are helpful for bond projects, only a limited percentage of actual costs are typically covered using this formula, leaving the rest of the cost to the school district and the local community (via a bond).

The plan also accounts for a \$130 million levy rollback, a 10% contingency for the bond, with the potential for a \$152.9 million state match, which would be collected as projects near 90 percent completion. (And a huge positive impact to our local economy).

# NO TAX RATE INCREASE. MAINTAIN OUR CURRENT RATE.



Over 21 years, the proposed **\$800M** bond tax rate would remain at the 2024 voter-approved rate of **\$4.14 per \$1,000 of** assessed value.

#### **CHALLENGE:**

February 11, 2025, Special Election BOND VALIDATION: 40% (28,422 Ballots) of the 71,055 ballots received from the

Nov. 5, 2024, General Election are required to validate the vote.

- Feb. 2025 40% validation turnout minimum = 28,422
- 91,400 x 28.32% = 25,881 (Voter turnout percentage, Feb 2024)
- 25,881 leaves an estimated gap of 2,541 to meet the required validation to the Nov 5<sup>th</sup> General Election.

### WHAT HAPPENS WITHOUT THIS FUNDING?







- After Feb 2025, we'd need to advertise a tax rate increase for any comparable bond measures as debt continues to be paid down.
- Costs will continue to rise, adding an estimated 4.5-6% increase in project costs year after year.
- Student population growth will continue to exceed available classroom space.
- Possible closure of facilities to prevent safety risk to students and staff.
- Must divert funding from basic education to address the most critical projects – impacting resources available for teaching and learning.
