A DAY IN THE LIFE

A Monarch's day begins with spending time outside before classes. Girls who arrive early can explore our campus while playing with friends, review for the day's studies, or simply enjoy the sunrise during carpool drop off. Once the bell rings, the girls head inside to their classrooms where they receive caring instruction that educates the whole person: heart, mind, body, and soul.

An example of this is seen in Language Arts, where students can be seen reciting poems in front of their class. The girls are encouraged to develop their skills in memorization, expression, and clarity during the recitations, allowing them to build true confidence. Monarchs can eventually use these skills and confidence on special days throughout the year in poetry competitions where they represent their school houses and strive to be heralded as "Poet Laureate."

With goal of sparking wonder in the world around us, you might find our girls outside bird watching, at their lab tables designing an experiment, or creating a classroom model of the heart and lungs. Learning to think and work like a scientist allows our students to begin to understand that the things they wonder about can be explored. In math, students go beyond working through problems in the book and experience concepts in practical, hands-on ways. Through group work, projects, and daily practice, these skills and habits build an enthusiasm for math.







A Magnolia School student spends her time on campus cultivating her own strengths and personality. Teachers encourage each individual girl, helping her to develop into a mature and confident leader who serves others. Lower School Students attend Art, Music, and PE classes multiple times per week, while Middle School students have the freedom to choose their electives. These electives vary from Intermediate Art and Musical Theatre to Applied Science and Mock Trial. Additionally, there are also more specialized clubs that meet outside of our typical school day.

In addition to her normal coursework, every student participates in a 1:1 Mentoring Program. You can often find mentors and mentees enjoying lunch together, and talking through scholastic and life challenges with wisdom. Mentors communicate and work with each student's parents to help guide the our Monarch's into wonderful women. Every day at Magnolia School gives our Monarchs the freedom to flourish and bring their specific gifts to the world.

A key element of the Magnolia School experience is our House System, which creates a deep sense of belonging, camaraderie, and a good measure of competition.
