WHAT IS WIC?

WIC (Women, Infants and Children) is a nutrition program that provides nutrition and health education, healthy food and other services free of charge to Massachusetts families who qualify.

WHAT DOES WIC OFFER?

WIC's goal is to get families off to a healthy start. To do this, WIC provides:

- Personalized nutrition consultations
- Free, healthy food
- Tips for eating well to improve health
- Referrals for medical and dental care, health insurance, child care, housing & fuel assistance, and other services that can benefit the whole family

But that's not all! WIC offers breastfeeding classes, one-on-one breastfeeding support, as well as immunization screening and referrals. WIC also provides parents with opportunities to talk with other parents about nutrition and other health topics that are important to their families.

WHO IS WIC FOR?

WIC is for all kinds of families: married and single parents, working or not working. If you are a father, mother, grand parent, foster parent or other legal guardian of a child under 5, you can apply for WIC for your child.

You can participate in WIC if you:

- Live in Massachusetts
- Have a nutritional need (WIC staff can help you determine this)
- Are pregnant, breastfeeding, or a child under 5
- Have a family income less than WIC guidelines

You are automatically income eligible for WIC if you are currently receiving TAFDC, SNAP or MassHealth. (MassHealth members with Family Assistance or CommonHealth coverage are not automatically income eligible.) Foster kids under age 5 are also automatically eligible for WIC.

WIC welcomes men! WIC recognizes the important role that fathers, grandparents, stepparents, and other guardians play in caring for kids. Fathers and other caregivers of kids under 5 are encouraged to enroll and bring kids to appointments, attend nutrition and health workshops, and use WIC in the grocery stores.

HOW DO I APPLY FOR WIC?

It's possible to start an application for WIC on-line by visiting www.mass.gov/wic or the Mass WIC Facebook page, @MassWIC. Interested families can click on 'Apply for WIC' and submit some basic information to get their application started. Or you can contact the WIC Program in your community to set up an appointment or call **1-800-942-1007**. Many WIC offices are open in the evenings and on Saturdays so you don't have to miss school or work. Walk-ins are always welcome!
