




Year of 9th Grade Enrollment - after July 1, 2008

- * Fourth unit may be used to meet Science and CTAE elective requirement.
- ** 3 Units required from CTAE and/or Fine Arts and/or World Language. Students planning on attending a four-year university must complete two units of World Language.
- *** State Requirements Four Additional Electives.
 Students have the opportunity to earn an additional four electives on the seven-period day.
 This option should be connected with the student's choice of a Career Pathway.
