

IS YOUR CHILD FEELING ILL?

As we enter cold and flu season, there are many things that can be done to keep our schools, homes, and communities healthy:

- As a general rule, students should stay home when they are feeling ill. It is recommended that sick individuals stay at home until their symptoms improve and they are fever-free for at least 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications.
- You can lower the risk of getting and spreading illnesses by:
 - o Washing hands often with soap and running water for at least 20 seconds
 - o Using hand sanitizer if hand washing is not available
 - o Coughing and sneezing into the upper shirt sleeve or elbow
 - o Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth
 - o Avoid close contact with others, such as shaking hands and sharing drinks and eating utensils
 - o Clean frequently touched surfaces such as door knobs, desks, countertops, and cell phones
 - o Stay up to date on recommended vaccinations
 - o Maintain a healthy diet, adequate rest, and proper hydration

BREAKFAST AND LUNCH AT WMS

Michigan School Free Meals will begin at the start of the 2024-25 school year, providing state reimbursement to schools for every breakfast and lunch served to Michigan public school students who receive meals through their school's participation in the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) National School Breakfast and Lunch Program. Ala carte items are also available for purchase. Student ala carte food accounts may be paid for by the week, month, or year. Online payments are made using the <u>family portal</u> or checks are written to Williamston Community Schools and delivered to the kitchen in the morning before school starts.

WEEKEND KIT PROGRAM - 2024-2025 SCHOOL YEAR

WMS is participating in the weekend kit program, which is supplemental to the free breakfast and lunch programs offered at school every day and is intended to meet the nutritional needs of children during non-school hours, specifically over weekends or longer breaks.

Weekend Kits are designed to slip discreetly into your child's backpack and are distributed to participating children every other week on Thursdays and are available at no cost to your family. There are no eligibility requirements to participate in this program.

Each Weekend Kit includes breakfast, lunch, dinner, and snack items and contains enough food to last each child two weekends. Foods included are kid-friendly items that are easy for your child to prepare or help prepare.

FOOD ALLERGIES

Classrooms at Williamston Middle School are designated as peanut and tree-nut-free to ensure the safety of all students. Please be vigilant about checking food labels to ensure that snacks from home are free from these allergens. ATTENDANCE

If your student is absent, please call the Attendance Line at 517-655-4668 (press #1) within 24 hours of the absence. On the recording, state the student's name, grade, date of absence, and reason for absence OR electronically submit an absence online through your PowerSchool account. If your child has an unexcused absence, then an automated message will be sent to parents/guardians.

SCHOOL MESSENGER NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

Williamston Community Schools utilizes a rapid notification system called School Messenger. This automated system notifies parents/guardians of school closings and other important messages. Messages are sent out based on information in our PowerSchool student information system. Parents/guardians can add additional phone numbers and email addresses to this system by logging into their PowerSchool Parent Access account. Instructions are found on the WCS website (www.gowcs.net) under the "Parents/Families" link.

AUTOMATED ATTENDANCE NOTIFICATION ENHANCEMENTS

In addition to our morning notification of unverified absences, we implemented an automated notification system to keep you updated on your child's attendance status for all of the class periods throughout the day. This system aims to foster better communication and support your child's educational experience.

What You Need to Know:

- **Timely Notifications**: You will receive automated notifications in the evening if your child is marked with an **Unverified Absence** or **Tardy** during the day. Unverified absences or tardies are reported per class period. This will provide you with timely information to ensure you are aware of your child's attendance.
- **Encouraging Attendance**: Regular attendance is crucial for academic success. By keeping you informed, we hope to encourage open dialogue about the importance of being present in school and arriving for class on time with the necessary materials. 
