



Of course, we want our kids to be successful and happy, but stirring new research says we may be missing what matters most in helping kids thrive—empathy!

Teens today are 40 percent less empathetic than they were just a generation ago; narcissism has increased 58 percent. But empathy can be cultivated in children, starting even before they can talk.
