

Wednesday, October 10



At around 8 a.m. this morning, Hinsdale South became aware of a threatening post circulating on social media that mentions violence at "Central" and "South". We quickly learned that the post mirrors and aligns to social media posts that have circulated in nearby communities and at schools across the country.

We immediately partnered with local law enforcement to investigate and after consulting several sources, they concluded this is not a credible threat. Following their advice, we will continue with our regularly scheduled school day.


The safety and security of District 86 students and staff members is our top priority. We take all threats seriously and immediately partner with local law enforcement when there is a safety concern.

Out of an abundance of caution, Hinsdale South immediately deployed the Weapons Detection System at our building and checked all bags upon entry. Once law enforcement told us that the threat was not credible, we removed the Weapons Detection System from our daily security protocol. As per our typical practice, we will continue to use the Weapons Detection System at tonight's football game.
















Students and parents are ultimately responsible for a child's actions in these matters, even when they happen online.

Please talk to your kids about this topic and monitor their social media posts.


REPORT DON'T REPOST



Our goal: Every D86 student and staff member can receive and offer education free from violence.

There are four components to this work.

Strategy 1	Ensure all students feel a sense of belonging at school.
Strategy 2	Provide comprehensive and easy-to-access mental health resources .
Strategy 3	Implement layers of physical security measures in our buildings, in coordination with local law enforcement.
Strategy 4	Establish supports and routines to coordinate and manage this work.
