TSI TESTING OPPORTUNITIES IN THE SPRING

The TSI Test will be given at WHS and will be able to accommodate a limited number of students at each testing session. You will receive an email if it gets full and you need to choose a new date. The cost of the test this year is; Full TSI Test (reading, writing, math) - \$20 and each individual part - \$7.

You will only be registered to take the test if you do **BOTH** steps above. **Students will receive an email within a** week of the scheduled testing date with details and confirmation. Sign-up by doing two things:
