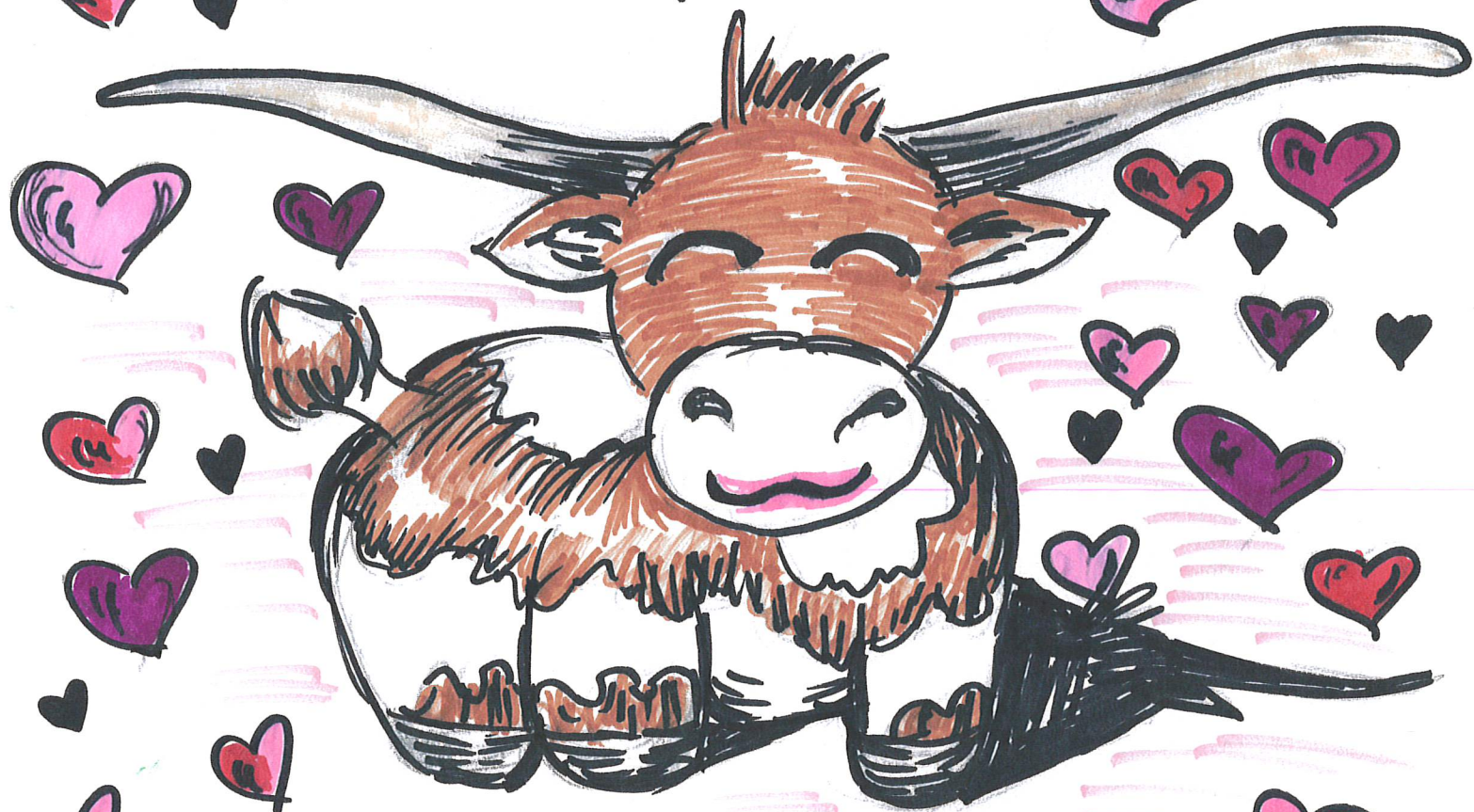

High School/Junior High

- **Senior students and parents** – Make sure to be filling out scholarship applications! Check the college website your child plans to attend, as well as ScholarshipQuest on the EducationQuest webpage. All scholarships I have sent out are also available in a 3-ring binder in the counseling office. Deadlines are fast approaching! Seniors need to let me know when they receive notification of being awarded a scholarship.
- **Senior parents** – If your senior plans to attend college next year the FAFSA is now open! Completing the FAFSA is a state-wide graduation requirement and is used to obtain postsecondary funding including grants, scholarships and federal loans. If assistance is needed in completing the FAFSA feel free to reach out to the EducationQuest office in Lincoln. This is a *free* service that can help! - The **Junior Class** will be taking the ACT as part of state-wide testing on Tuesday, April 8 and a practice ACT on Friday, March 21. Both of these days we will meet at the Community Building. - The **Sophomore Class** will be taking the Pre-ACT on Tuesday, March 18. Taking the Pre-ACT helps prepare students for what to expect when taking the ACT during their junior year. This test will begin at 8:10 a.m. and will last most of the morning.
- **8th grade** – During 3rd quarter, 8th grade students have guidance class. In this class we are learning about the importance of soft skills in the workplace and college and career options. The 8th grade class will have the concession stand on February 7 and will be going on a college visit to Hastings College and Central Community College on Wednesday, March 26. More information will be sent home closer to both dates.

Keep Your Elementary Schooler Motivated With These Strategies

You don't just want your child to learn. You want your child to want to learn! Motivation drives students to put in effort, persevere and achieve goals.

To motivate your elementary schooler to put effort into learning:

- Stay engaged. When families are involved in education, kids do better in school. Talk about school, monitor schoolwork and communicate with the teacher regularly.
- Have a positive outlook. Say that you believe your child can succeed in school. And if your student struggles, work with the teacher to find solutions.
- Promote independence. Give your child age-appropriate freedoms—choosing between two places to read, or whether to do math before or after dinner, for example.
- Correct mistakes in positive ways. “You spelled everything right except these two words! I bet you can learn them with practice” is more motivating than “You seem to struggle with spelling.”
- Give specific compliments. It's better to say, “Your report is written so neatly. I can tell that you really took your time” than “Nice handwriting.”
- Add more to learning. Let school lessons spark your imagination. Visit educational websites with your child. Take a trip to the state capital, plant a window garden or calculate distances between points on map together.

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Help Your Elementary Schooler Succeed on Standardized Tests

Standardized tests have been used to measure student achievement and ability for many years. But it's important to remember that one test doesn't represent a child's total abilities. A student may get high grades on classwork, for example, but be too anxious on test day to think clearly.

To support your child's success on standardized tests:

- Make schoolwork a priority. Students who test well tend to be the ones who study and finish assignments on time. They also miss less school than other students.
- Communicate with teachers. In addition to finding out how your child is doing throughout the year, ask about test details, such as, “Which skills do the tests measure?” “How can I help my child prepare?”
- Develop healthy routines. Your child needs adequate sleep and a nutritious breakfast every day before school—especially on the days leading up to a test.
- Promote reading. Most tests require reading, so make sure your child reads often. Reading skills get stronger with regular practice.
- Reduce anxiety. Help your child stay calm and positive. If nervous, your child can take deep breaths and say, “I can do this!” Remind your child that your love is not dependant on high test scores.

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Mantenga a su estudiante motivado con estas estrategias

Usted no quiere que su hijo tan solo aprenda. ¡Quiere que su hijo quiera aprender! La motivación impulsa a los estudiantes a esforzarse, perseverar y alcanzar objetivos.

Para motivar a su escolar de primaria a esforzarse en el aprendizaje:

- Manténgase involucrado. Cuando las familias se involucran en la educación, a los niños les va mejor en la escuela. Hable sobre la escuela, controle el trabajo escolar y comuníquese con el maestro con frecuencia.
- Tenga una visión positiva. Diga que considera que su hijo puede alcanzar el éxito en la escuela. Y si su estudiante tiene dificultades, trabaje con el maestro para encontrar soluciones.
- Promueva la independencia. Dele a su hijo libertades adecuadas para su edad: elegir entre dos lugares para leer o si hacer la tarea de matemáticas antes o después de cenar, por ejemplo.
- Corrija los errores de manera positiva. “¡Has escrito todo correctamente excepto estas dos palabras! Estoy seguro de que podrás aprenderlas si practicas” es más motivador que “Pareces estar teniendo dificultades con la ortografía”.
- Haga comentarios específicos. Es mejor decir, “Tu informe está escrito de manera muy ordenada. Me doy cuenta de que le dedicaste mucho tiempo” que “Bonita letra”.
- Súmele más cosas al aprendizaje. Permita que las lecciones escolares despierten su imaginación. Ingrese a sitios web educativos con su hijo. Viajen a la capital del estado, armen una huerta en la ventana o calculen juntos las distancias entre puntos del mapa.

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Ayude a su hijo a rendir bien en los exámenes estandarizados

Los exámenes estandarizados se han utilizado durante varios años para medir los logros y las capacidades de los estudiantes. Pero es importante recordar que un examen no representa todas las capacidades de un niño. Un estudiante podría obtener calificaciones altas en el trabajo en clase, por ejemplo, pero estar demasiado nervioso el día del examen para pensar con claridad.

Para respaldar el éxito de su hijo en los exámenes estandarizados:

- Asegúrese de que el trabajo escolar sea una prioridad. Los estudiantes que obtienen buenos resultados en los exámenes suelen ser los que estudian y terminan los trabajos a tiempo. También faltan menos a la escuela que otros estudiantes.
- Comuníquese con los maestros. Además de averiguar cómo le está yendo a su hijo a lo largo del año, pregunte sobre los detalles de los exámenes, como “¿Qué habilidades miden los exámenes?” “¿Cómo puedo ayudar a mi hijo a prepararse?”
- Desarrolle rutinas saludables. Su hijo necesita dormir lo suficiente y desayunar comida nutritiva todos los días antes de ir a la escuela, especialmente en los días anteriores a un examen.
- Promueva la lectura. La mayoría de los exámenes requieren leer. Por lo tanto, asegúrese de que su hijo lea con frecuencia. Las habilidades de lectura se fortalecen cuando se ponen en práctica con frecuencia.
- Reduzca la ansiedad. Ayude a su hijo a mantenerse en calma y positivo. Si está nervioso, debería respirar hondo y decir “¡Puedo hacerlo!” Recuérdele a su hijo que su amor no depende de que obtenga puntajes altos en los exámenes.

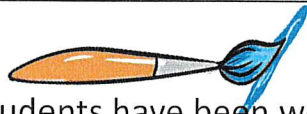
SPEECH AND DRAMA
