Understanding Credits

Final Grades

Your grade in each class is final at the end of each semester.

Grading Scale

A (90+)
B (80-89)
C (70-79)
F (<70)

You must earn a 70 or higher to pass a class.

7 additional points are awarded to a passing grade in honors, AP, and Dual Enrollment courses


On-Track vs. Off-Track

In the middle of 9th grade, you should have earned at least **3.0** credits. Each class (with a few exceptions) earns 0.5 credit per semester

Graduation in 4 Years

- Students must earn **23.0** credits to graduate from high school
- Your counselor tracks your progress toward graduation, and so should you!

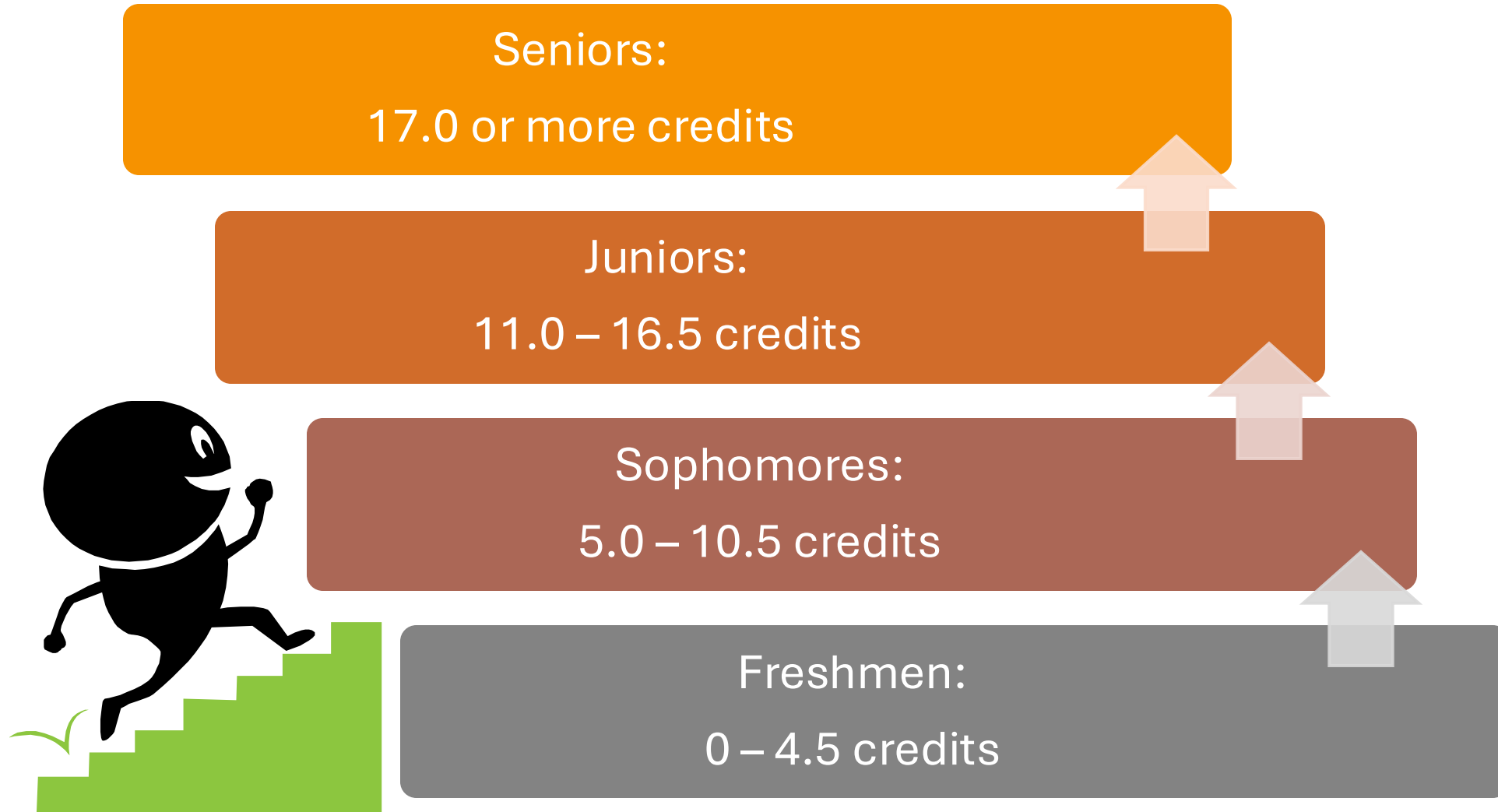

Something is better than nothing!!

Receiving even partial credit for an assignment will not hurt your grades as much as a zero.

What if I fail a class?

Retake class(es) in the summer

- Face-to-face summer school
- Fulton Virtual School (FVS)
- Georgia Virtual School (GAVS)
- Registration is typically the first week in March

Credit Recovery

- Only available during the school year
- Taken fully online
- Must be passing all your classes before your counselor will add you to credit recovery
- **NOT** approved by the NCAA, so not recommended for students who want to play sports for a college in the future

Add course back to schedule in the future (if there is room)

Reminder: Grades for **ALL** attempted classes are shown on the transcript. If a student fails a class and retakes it, the new grade does not replace the failing grade. If retained at the start of the school year, you will be placed in your previous grade level.



No Pass, No Play

Students must meet certain eligibility requirements to participate in GHSA sports for Chattahoochee:

- Must be on track to graduate (not retained in a lower grade)
- Must have passed **5** classes the semester before their sport starts
- Up to **2.0** credits earned in Summer School combined with Spring semester grades/credits for Fall sports eligibility

Example - students who fail 2 classes in the Fall semester are automatically not eligible for Spring sports.





HOPE/ZELL Miller Scholarship

HOPE/Zell Miller Scholarship Requirements

For HOPE Scholarship students must graduate with a **3.0** as calculated by GSFC.

- The Georgia Student Finance Commission calculates the GPA, not Fulton County Schools.
- At least **4 rigor requirements** must be met. Chattahoochee High School is an eligible accredited high school that will upload final transcripts to GSFC.
- **A portion of tuition is paid to a public Georgia college.** It does not include books, fees, housing, meals, etc. It is just a portion of tuition. The award amount can fluctuate from year to year. This information is available on the Ga Futures website. For any private institution, it is typically a flat award amount per semester, not a percentage of tuition.
- **Must maintain a 3.0 GPA in college**

For Zell Miller Scholarship students must graduate with a **3.7** as calculated by GSFC.

- The Georgia Student Finance Commission calculates the GPA, not Fulton County Schools. **At least 4 rigor requirements must be met.**
- Students must also earn a required test score before high school graduation
- **ACT** – a composite of **25** or higher on a single national administration or **SAT** – a total test score of **1200** on a single national administration
- Chattahoochee High School is an eligible accredited high school that will upload final transcripts to GSFC.
- **Tuition will be paid to a public Georgia college** if a student is Zell Miller eligible, and a small portion will be paid if it is a private school. Check the website for specific award amounts. It does not include books, student fees, meal plans, housing, etc. or HOPE Scholarship students must graduate with a 3.0 as calculated by GSFC.
- **Must maintain a 3.3 in college GPA in college**

GPA and Scholarships

- Fulton County Schools GPA is on a Cumulative Numeric Average.
- HOPE and Zell Miller Scholarships are 2 of the most common scholarships
- You can track your HOPE progress GPA after grades are posted every semester in high school.
- Your final HOPE GPA is calculated after you graduate by the GA Student Finance Commission.

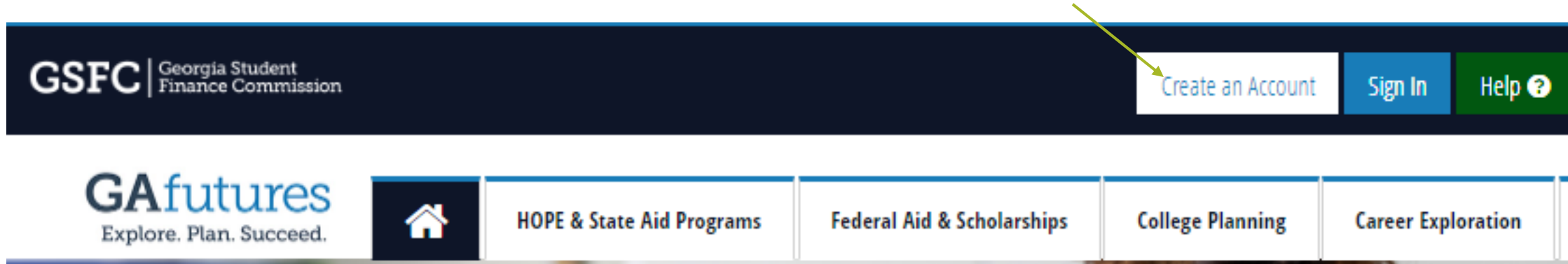

Track your HOPE Progress GPA



- Create an account on www.GAFutures.org
- Be sure to enter your full **legal** name, your correct birthday, your correct Social Security # (if applicable), and your correct high school (some students accidentally select Chattahoochee County HS)
- If all fields are accurately entered, you will be able to see your HOPE progress GPA, through 1st semester at the end of January.
- Then, after each semester in high school, your HOPE progress GPA will automatically update a few weeks after grades post.



Dual Enrollment General Info

What is Dual Enrollment?

- Provides funding for high school students to attend Georgia colleges, universities, and technical schools and take approved college-level coursework for credit toward both high school and college graduation requirements.
- **11th & 12th Graders** - Eligible students may take any approved Dual Enrollment courses listed on the Course Directory, at an eligible participating postsecondary institution.
- Participants must meet admission requirements for the individual institution at which they wish to enroll.
- Classes are offered during Summer, Fall, and Spring terms.
- Students cannot take more than 15 credit hours each semester. Most take one or two classes (3-6 credit hours) online through the college to have more flexibility with the high school schedule.
- All communication from the college goes through the student, not the parent.
- Students can take classes at the local college or online from home. **DE classes must be taken off campus. We do not schedule any DE classes on campus so they must be able to have transportation to get to the colleges.**
- Chattahoochee HS parking passes are awarded at the discretion of the Administration, not the Counseling Office.

Grade Level Eligibility

9th Graders

- Students in the 9th grade are not eligible to participate in the Dual Enrollment Program.

10th Graders

- Eligible students may enroll in approved Career, Technical, and Agricultural Education (CTAE) courses listed on the Course Directory at a participating Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG) institution.
- Eligible students who have a minimum **SAT score of 1200** or minimum **ACT composite score of 25** in a single national test administration, may enroll in any approved courses listed on the Course Directory at a TCSG, USG (University System of Georgia), or private eligible participating postsecondary institution.

***Note: GSFC (Georgia Student Finance Commission) must have the required qualifying test score(s) on file before the high school or home study approving courses on the student's Dual Enrollment funding Application.*

11th & 12th Graders

- Eligible students may take any approved Dual Enrollment courses listed on the Course Directory, at an eligible participating postsecondary institution.

Naviance & Careers

Naviance is a comprehensive college and career readiness solution for middle and high schools that helps students explore career options and plan for their future.

Each year in high school you will have a different activity that you are required to complete by the State.

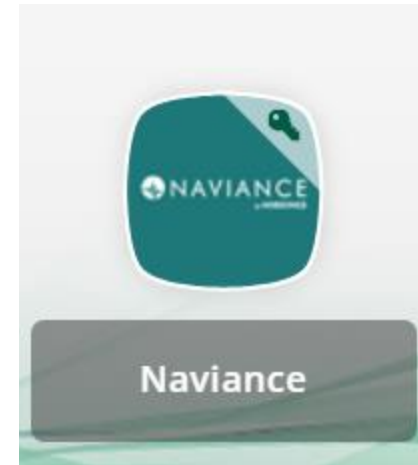
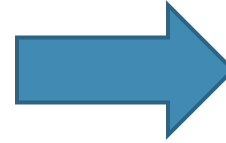
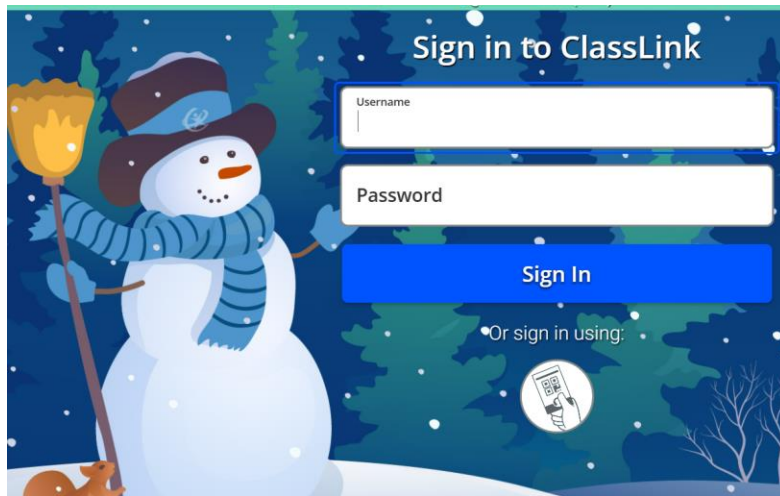

- We will run reports to make sure that everyone has completed it
- Some of the activities and assessments will help you decide which elective course you may want to choose.

Scheduling

Scheduling For Next Year

- Teachers have already begun making their recommendations for class placements for the next year.
- Current **elective teachers** will recommend your placements for next year.
- One-to-one meetings will be scheduled through your Lit course.
- If you would like an online class, **you must complete an online contract and submit it at your one-to-one** (this is for the full year). We will not allow you to change to online once school begins. **This is a change from previous years. All students can have up to 3 online classes.**
- World Language—Most colleges require two years of the same world language. If you do not currently have a world language class and you would like to be able to attend a four-year college then you will need to select a world language class for one of your elective spaces next year (options are Spanish, French, or Latin).

Scheduling Timeline

- **Week of January 27th and February 3rd** – counselors will be available in the cafeteria to answer quick, general questions about classes for next year: Mondays – 2nd half of 3rd period, Tuesdays – all of 4th period, Wednesdays – 2nd half of 3rd period, and Thursdays – 1st half of 5th period.
- 2/3/25-All students will be able to view their placements and elective recommendations in the IC portal. Students should use the course catalog to look at course options and descriptions. Desired changes can be made in the one-to-one meetings.
- **1/30/2025** - 9th & 10th Grade Parent Night at 5:30 pm on Teams. Link to join the virtual meeting was sent via the Naviance email blast on 1/16 and the Hooch Happenings email blast on 1/17 - please ask your parents to check their inboxes. Topics include: typical 10th & 11th grade schedules, planning for a balanced course load, review of graduation requirements, understanding your GPA, overview of HOPE/Zell Miller Scholarships and Grants, and more. The meeting will be recorded and posted on the Counseling Department website <https://chattahoochee.fultonschools.org/students-families/chs-counseling> afterward.
- **2/4/2025** – Dual Enrollment Information Presentation at 5:30 pm on Teams. Link to join the virtual meeting was sent via Naviance email blast to parents/guardians on 1/15 the Hooch Happenings email blast on 1/17 - please ask your parents to check their inboxes. The meeting will be recorded and posted on <https://ChattahoocheeDE.weebly.com> afterward.
- **2/10 – 2/21/2025** – all 9th – 11th graders will come with their English classes to the Media Center on an assigned day to meet individually with their counselor and review their teachers' course recommendations for the 2025-2026 school year. These meetings are called One-to-One's. Students will be able to request changes to their courses and/or added electives at this time. This meeting will conclude the requests so the master schedule can be built.
- **2/24 – 2/28/2025** – 10-minute meetings with counselors available for students/parents to discuss any remaining scheduling questions for the 2025-2026 school year. Links to schedule these meetings will be included in the Hooch Happenings email blast ahead of time - please ask your parents to check their inboxes.
- **2/28/2025** – deadline for students to submit the online contract to take Fulton Virtual or GA Virtual classes in the 2025-2026 school year – this includes both Fall and Spring semesters. **Online can only be requested during this time. No online classes can be added during the school year (this is New).** Online contracts are not needed for Summer classes.

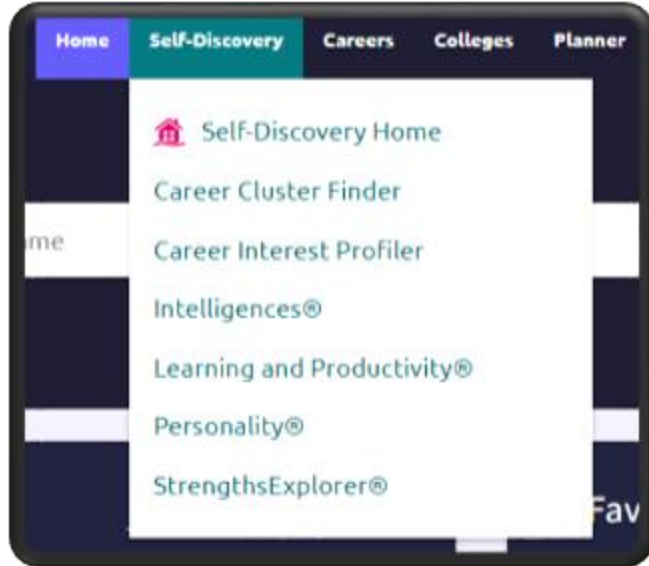

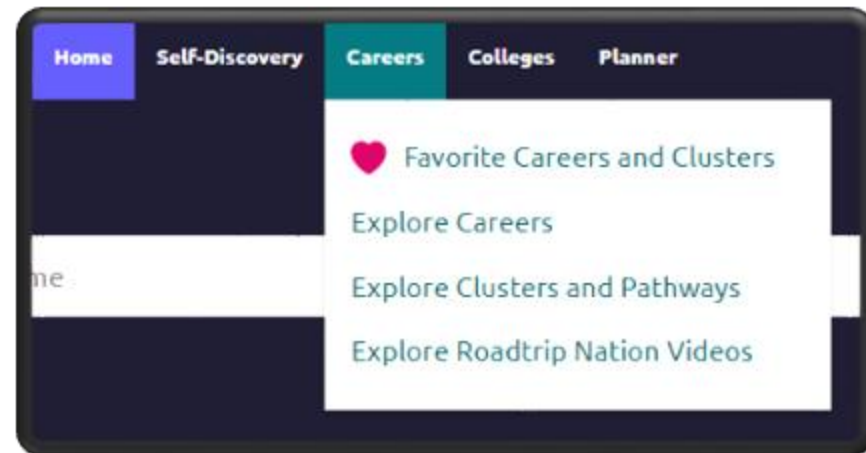
