Welcome and Introductions - Karen Shapiro, DPC President

<u>Superintendent's Report</u> - John Hood, Superintendent

- We have 2 new Board of Ed members Leeni Shrestha and Jason Burns. They are going through orientation which Katie and Andy are leading.
- Mary Gebara resigned as she accepted a position with "Prevent to Protect." Okemos applied and was accepted into that program. We need to fill her position by January 9th. Applications are due tomorrow at noon.
- Bond: New design for Cornell. Placing all needs within design.
- Chippewa bids to build most of Chippewa and amenities. (Now just foundation and groundwork.) Bid closer so not so expensive for future unknown inflation. Christman is overseeing (construction manager). Tower Pinkster architecture.
- Concerts happening across district.
- Shannon B Nathan Brown is our new Digital Communications Specialist. He will be managing website updates.
- Points of Pride Great relationship with Township Police (Chief Grillo).
- MI heart safe designation all schools (Fib, trainings, materials)
- Revised budget We are in a deficit due to increased insurance costs, our foundation allowance did not increase as expected, and higher (unexpected) environmental remodeling costs. New aides as well. Can take from fund balance (12.9% rainy day fund).
- Received FilterFirst clean water grant \$93,000
- Also received other funds from the stated for environmental remediation \$100,000.

Board of Education Report - Katie Cavanaugh

- Mary stepping down. She was president the last 3 years. We had 30 days to fill Mary's BOE spot (per ISD). Board met Thursday to decide on interviewees.
- Interview Jan. 6th must be Okemos resident. January 13th for new president.
- Universal accommodations in our schools giving kids what they need (extended time, verbal vs. written, breaks, flex seating, preferential seating). Each building has their own universal accommodations. (Hopefully they will all be the same in the future).
- High School all work is due at the end of a unit.
- This is the trend across districts, but more at the elementary levels.
- Discussion of Universal Acommodations. Positive, but with some concerns pertaining to college prep.
- Two new members have been trained.
- Sleep seminar (U of M presenter) November 19th. Would be good for high school.
- January 28th Board of Ed sleep/nutrition for wellness presentation at Kinawa.

- New Strategic Plan
- \$1 million Kinawa remediation (mold) removing all carpets and retiling
- 6% increase for teachers' union insurance.
- MASB conference October. Discussed school start times with other Ingham County schools. Will invite in January to present to them.

Principal's Report - Tracey Ojerio, Cornell Elementary Principal

- Bond work really thinking about what we want to create here. Two year temporary move to Chippewa, Fall 2026. Thinking about what we will need there.
- New audio enhancements, cameras Better view inside and out. Safer now with secure vestibule.
- Last year created vision of Cornell empowering student voice. Classroom leadership/mentorship.
- Diversity Global Cornell event and more.
- Cross-grade interaction: reading buddies/equity lens
- Dislexia training
- Looking at multi-tiered levels of support. Getting counselors involved for those who need support.
- Cornell now has 470-475 students. 115 new dwellings just built in the Cornell area.

Presentation - Brian Lieber - Director of Operations & Facility Use

Bond

- New Chippewa under construction Can now see the new gym
- Maintenance areas being built
- Looking into how Cornell will flow in (temporary Cornell at the Old Chippewa). A lot more children in the building.
- Looking at old contracts vs. new contracts. Our day and night cleaning crews are different. Day cleaners are Okemos employees, night cleaners are private contractors.
- New groundsperson hired (from MSU)
- Working on new equipment (costly) for grounds.
- Every school has one lead daytime custodian. All spots are filled.
- Still need to hire maintenance workers.
- Wolf mascot will arrive at the end of Jan./beginning of February. Available for all big events!
- Q: Corrinne Since most schools have big fall fundraisers, is it possible to move the Okemos summer run earlier? Schools are thinking that the summer run has interfered with fall fundraising efforts. A: Will look into. Possibly May.
- High school having heating issues a computer issue. The building is 30 years old, so there are
 problems that need to be addressed. Consumers and Trane will look at HS HVAC system. (Can
 stretch bond money).
- Q: Will 3 lunch periods stay at the HS? Yes. One period is split, but may be altered.
- Wardcliff property just for storage now. Still hoping to demolish in the future.
