## JUNIOR OPTIMIST YOUTH ATTITUDE (JOYA) SCHOLARSHIP

The Lebanon Chapter of Optimist International is pleased to be able to provide scholarships of no more than \$500.00 to \$1,000.00 to eligible Lebanon Area graduating seniors.

Scholarships may be used for tuition, books, materials or fees in connection with attendance at an accredited institution or trade school. All checks will be issued to the institution or trade school upon receipt of written confirmation of registration/ attendance from the institution or trade school. All scholarship funds must be disbursed prior to December 31<sup>st</sup> the year the scholarship was awarded. If the scholarship funds are not disbursed prior to December 31<sup>st</sup>, the scholarship may become null and void.

## **Eligibility:**

Any graduating senior who has previously been the recipient of a JOYA Award is eligible to apply for a JOYA scholarship.

### **Requirements:**

- Completed application form to include evidence of JOYA Award (i.e.: copy of award certificate, school plaque or Awards Night program.)
- Completed application to include printed essay (computer or typewritten) per guidelines.
- Completed application to include ONE letter of recommendation per guidelines

### **Application Deadline:**

The completed application form must be returned to your school main office on or before March 14, 2025 by noon.
