



ROTC in College (p. 36)

- College students who take ROTC will enter the military as trained officers.
- Army, Air Force, & Navy/Marine ROTC-Four year scholarships pay tuition, lab fees, educational fees and \$100 allowance a month.
- Military Educational Funding Programs:
 - All branches have this program and it can be used after or during military service to pay for college or special training.

Military Service Academies

- Competition is high so students are urged to apply to every nominating authority (ex.2 senators, congressman, Presidential nomination, Vice Presidential nomination, Disabled Veterans Organization.
- Students should contact their choice soon after Jan 31of junior year and send a written request for an application to your State Senator or Representative in April of your junior year.
