MEVA mission and vision statement

Maine Virtual Academy's (MEVA) mission is to develop each student's full potential with learnercentered instruction, research-based curriculum and educational tools and resources to provide a high quality learning experience for grade 7-12 students who are in need of alternative educational options. MEVA will develop an Individualized Learning Plan (ILP) with specific learning goals to meet each student's needs.

MEVA's rigorous curriculum is aligned to the eight Maine content areas, the Maine Learning Results, the Common Core State Standards and the Next Generation Science Standards. MEVA will demand the highest level of accountability from our Maine-certified teachers, our educational management system and our nationally recognized provider of educational services. The MEVA Board will contract with Stride K12 for educational products and selected support services.

FAFSA

Financial Aid Information Sessions-Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) application is now open!

FSA ID Creation- Now is the time to create their Federal Student Aid accounts (FSA IDs) at StudentAid.gov. Individuals should create their FSA IDs before the release of the FAFSA so that their demographic information can be matched with the Social Security Administration. This is what allows federal tax information to be transferred from the IRS, making FAFSA completion much easier!

Federal Student Aid just released the "parent wizard" to help families determine which parents' information is required on the FAFSA and which parent(s) needs to log into the FAFSA with their FSA ID. FAFSA

Mitchell Scholarship

On December 1, we will open the Mitchell Scholarship application here: www.mitchellinstitute.org/scholarship/. As some of you may know, that's a month earlier than usual – and you can learn more about the change on our update page. Our hope is that students can now open the application while working on college applications, and perhaps even finish the application over winter break. We also have a new series of videos designed to help them work through the application with ease and clarity.

A few key details for you and your students:

The deadline to submit the online application is March 1.

The completed application, transcript, recommendation letter, and the FAFSA Submission Summary (FSS) will be due by March 1. Copies of the college acceptance and financial aid information will be due, if available, by April 1.

The Mitchell Scholarship is \$10,000.

We will award at least one scholarship at every public Maine high school – yes, your school may have more than one Mitchell Scholar!

Students are eligible to apply if they are planning to pursue a two-year or four-year degree program at an accredited college or university (in or out of Maine).

Mitchell Scholars also have access to additional funding, signature events, ongoing advising, and a community of over 600 fellow Scholars and 3,000 Alumni.

Worthington Scholarship

The Worthington Scholarship is now open for applicants! Deadline to apply is April 15th, 2025. The Worthington Scholarship is intended for low and middle income students.

- Graduating senior from a WSF partner high school.
- SAI of 30,000 or less as determined by the FAFSA
- For 4-year college scholarship, a high school GPA of B- or higher
- For community college scholarship, a high school GPA of C- or higher
- Full-time enrollment at a WSF partner college in Fall 2025

The MDOE requires schools to conduct vision screenings and/or refer students to vision screenings who are in grades 1, 3, 5, 7 and 9. MEVA audits students in the 7th and 9th grades to ensure screenings were conducted either in the previous school or by private effort. We are requesting MEVA parents/legal guardians of 7th and 9th graders to please complete the survey (if you haven't already done so) to update the status of your student's last vision screening: Vision Screening Form. If your student is overdue for a vision screening and/or you need financial assistance to cover glasses, see below for resources that may be able to help! Students who qualify for MaineCare can have their exam and glasses covered in full, under the age of 21.
