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Parent Handbook Highlight

In September, each parent receives a parent handbook (in student agenda's) full of important information about policies and procedures at Cady Stanton. Each month the newsletter will highlight some important information. This month, we are highlighting School Parties and Treats.

Parties or classroom celebrations must be directed by the classroom teacher. For a birthday, a child may bring in a treat to be shared with the class. This should be cleared with your child's teacher in advance to ensure proper accommodations are made for any students with food allergies. 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Winter Health Reminder!

A healthy school environment requires the cooperation and effort of us all working together. During this time of year we tend to see a higher incidence of illness (strep throat, flu, covid, gastrointestinal illnesses). It can be hard to know when to send children to school if they tell you that they do not feel well.

Here are a few examples of when you should keep your child home and/or contact your child's doctor:

- * Fever greater than 100.4 (taken by mouth)
- * Vomiting and/or diarrhea within the last 24 hours
- * Severe sore throat along with fever and feeling ill for more than 48 hours
- * Honey-crusted sore near the nose /mouth or rash on other parts of the body
- * Large amounts of mucous (liquid) from their nose
- * Severe ear pain or fluid coming from the ear
- * Persistent productive cough
- * Eyes that are red, swollen and draining

Please keep children home for 24 hours after their fever ends or they have completed 24 hours of medication if prescribed by your health care provider.

Healthy habits to protect yourself and others from illness!

- * Wash your hands often
- * Avoid close contact with people who are sick
- * Stay home if you are not feeling well
- \star Cover your cough or sneeze
- * Throw away used tissues
- * Try not to touch your eyes, nose or mouth
- * Dress for the weather

CURRICULUM CORNER

Each month information will be shared about what your child is learning in school. This will be an overview of topics being learned; please contact your child's teacher for more details as needed. If you have special talents or knowledge of a topic to be studied that you would like to share, please reach out to your child's teacher.

We would love for you to share in our students' learning!

Grade 3: In Math, it is all about the data! We will generate and organize data using tape diagrams, scaled bar graphs, and charts. We will also work to solve word problems involving graphs. Then, we will begin our work with Geometry by decomposing and recomposing shapes, and relating side lengths with tiles. We will extend our knowledge of multiplication to understand area, use rows and columns to find area, and interpret area models. In ELA, we will continue to work on text structures and learn to identify the main idea and supporting details of a text. Then, we will apply what we learned about informational texts to study the culture, customs, and traditions of Japan! **In** Science, we will wrap up our unit on Heredity, Survival, and Selection: Fates of Traits. In Social Studies, we will begin our unit on Human Rights. Our February holidays of study will include Ramadan!

Grade 4: This month students are learning about Colonial Trades. They will be using the information learned to develop an informational writing piece. This will lead us to our Colonial Day celebration on February 14th. More information will be coming regarding this fun day! Our math focus turns to Geometry. Students will be exploring angles and properties of shapes. Please continue to practice the spelling words each week!

<u>Grade 5:</u> Fifth grade mathematicians will be finishing up Module 3, which focused on adding and subtracting fractions. Our next unit of study will be Module 4, where we will dive into multiplication and division of fractions. In ELA, students will be wrapping up their Who Was books and will create and present their learning about their chosen individual. This is a fantastic opportunity for them to showcase what they have learned about important figures who overcame challenges related to civil rights. Additionally, students are practicing reading debate topics to spark opinions, while our writing unit will focus on forming opinions and using articles for text evidence. This unit will continue throughout February & March. In social studies, students are concluding their inquiry on "Why Do Countries Declare Independence?" by analyzing sections of the U.S. Declaration of Independence for a deeper understanding. Lastly, the DARE program has begun, and students will have a DARE lesson each week.
