


CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS



ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE


Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.


ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2019-20 graduating in 2022-23.




FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

Instruction not only seeks high academic standards through a project-based learning approach, but also a focus on career connected skills to prepare youth for the workforce.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is collaborating with school districts and communities across the state to achieve a 90% on-time graduation rate by 2027. Grounded in the pillars of Academic Excellence, Belonging and Wellness, and Reimagined Accountability, ODE prioritizes evidence-based practices to boost early literacy, attendance, and student engagement. We are committed to closing opportunity and achievement gaps for marginalized students and securing long-term success for all of Oregon's learners by investing in culturally responsive practices, fostering inclusive environments and always driving for continuous improvement.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

Phoenix Charter School strives to ensure all students, and their families, feel welcome in our school community. Our program design has every student linked with at a minimum one adult who knows their story and can support them along their journey. Our Pathways teachers assist the direct needs of students who may benefit from wraparound services. SafeOregon allows anonymous reporting to reduce bullying and harassment. Affinity Groups empower student voice to craft further safe spaces for student groups.

About Our School

ADVANCED COURSEWORK

Phoenix Charter School offers a Learning On Fast Track (LOFT) program which allows highly motivated students the opportunity to graduate faster than the normal 4-year duration of high school. Phoenix Charter School offers an Early College Program which provides students the opportunity to attend and earn dual credits at our local Umpqua Community College either online or directly on campus at the college.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Phoenix Charter School is directly partnered with our regional workforce board to provide the opportunity for direct case management and coaching for students nearing graduation to be hired by local employers by joining our EPIC (Employment Planning, Internships, & Coaching) program. Students can also be hired to join our resident Oregon Youth Corps programs and serve the community while gaining direct work experience during their school day. All students have the option of enrolling in a variety of CTE courses and work programs focused on: Food & Farm, Forestry & Natural Resources, Trades & Design, and/or Wellness & Resilience.
