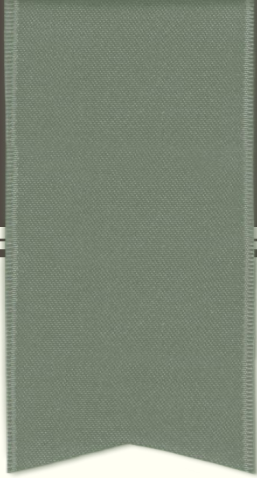

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# CURRICULAR TOOLS AND RESOURCES NEW IN 2024-2025

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- Expanded the adoption of *Heggerty Phonic Awareness* to grade 2
- Expanded access to **My Reading Academy/My Math Academy** to advance reading and math skills for grade 3
- Adopted **new instructional series for English** grades 9-12 with Study Sync (McGraw Hill)
- Implemented our **Sayreville District Writing Assessment** in grades 4-10 successfully.
- New Courses at SWMHS 2024-2025: *American Sign Language II, Freshman Foundations, Film Studies, History of New Jersey*
- Explore interventional math programs and screening tool for tier 2 mathematics.
- Revised over 37 curriculum guides in all content areas, grades PK-12.
- Piloted the Study Sync series by McGraw Hill for English grades 6-8.
- Developed and implemented a grant funded Climate Change program at Sayreville Middle School.

# Expanded Opportunities for Sayreville Public Schools Community

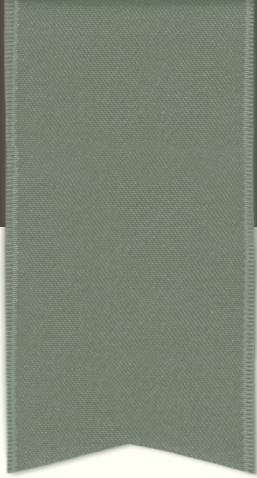
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## For Students:

- Continued to provide extended school year for students PK-12 through Learning Acceleration, Camp XL, SMS Credit Recovery, AP Bootcamp funded through Federal Grant Money and locally
- Expanded dual enrollment course offerings to move closer to our goal of providing students opportunity to earn an associate degree in general liberal arts upon graduation through Middlesex.
- Enhanced our music programs through purchasing new instruments at MS and HS
- Local funding for extracurricular activities related to multiple content areas such as DECA, FBLA, Odyssey of the Mind, Academies at SWMHS, Technology Student Association, and more
- Expanded Learning Academies at HS using local funds to support students in being successful on NJSLA and NJGPA
- Developed and implemented Climate Change Awareness Program at SMS using a NJDOE Grant awarded for 2024-2025.

## For Staff:

- Continued to use federal grant funding to provide Sheltered Instruction Observational Protocols for staff to support growing ML population
- Provided consistent, targeted professional development to teachers through partnership with 4 Love of Literacy, NJ Teacher to Teacher and others.

# 2024-2025 Curriculum and Instructional Proposed New Expenses

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## Opportunities for Students and Staff

Update elective offerings at SWMHS including *American Sign Language III*, *Biological Life Sciences* and *Algebra II Data Science at SWMHS*

Continue to work with Professional Development Director and district instructional coach to provide support and training for staff in meeting ever changing needs of our students

Restructure our Media Communications department at HS to add Filmmaking

Locally fund interventional tutorials K-12 as well as Tier 3 tutoring as needed

Continue to provide virtual on-demand tutoring for grades 6-12

Locally fund competitive co-curricular teams, activities and transportation for field trips

## Curriculum and Instructional Tools

Adopt the well received English series, **Study Sync by McGraw Hill** that was piloted this year for all students in grades 6-8

Expand **Heggerty** program to include decodable libraries for grades K-2

Implement a Climate Change Awareness program at SUES using additional grant funding from NJDOE

Implement math resources for intervention in grades 4-8, Successmaker, to enhance Envision program.

Adopt and implement math screener, grades K-5 (Momentum) to better identify students needing assistance

Expansion of Sayreville Writing Assessment program to grade 3

Adoption of tools for literacy in elementary grades such as Readers and Writers notebooks by Heinemann

New textbooks (online) for Marketing and Chemistry at HS

Continue the revision of existing curriculum guides and development of new guides as needed

# District Curriculum Budget Comparison

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In addition to new programs, continued local funding for:

- Classroom instructional supplies for all courses such as journals, whiteboards, anchor chart paper, etc.
- Consumables for current instructional programs
- English novels and supplemental texts grades 6-12
- Mathematics manipulatives, science lab materials, materials for Foods, Auto and Wood Shop.
- Annual Licensing for online resources related to text series such as Envision, StudySync, Spanish, History.
- Annual licensing for online tools such as ST Math, MyReading/MyMath, Achieve 3000, Silas (SEL), Belouga, Discovery Education etc.
- Replacement textbooks due to attrition and enrollment for all subjects
