Advanced Computer Science:

Survey & Standard (College Preparatory): Courses that provide instruction to enhance skills in reading, writing, research, critical comprehension, thinking and reasoning.

Advanced & Honors (College Preparatory): Courses that demand high levels of cognitive and problem-solving processes. The instructional pace is rigorous and emphasizes curricular depth, breadth, and enrichment.

Advancement Placement (AP) & Dual Credit: Accelerated courses that offer students the opportunity to earn college credit in high school. These courses will be aligned to College Board or university standards and may require a significant amount of independent work.

Independent Study: Students can propose independent study projects to take advanced study not offered in the curriculum. Courses earn 1 credit per semester. Projects can be taken for pass/fail or a grade. Unusual difficulty may qualify for Honors designation on a pass-fail basis.
