Message from the Superintendent



Dear Parents/Guardians and Community Members:

It is with great pride and celebration that our school district has unveiled and opened our new school, the Tonawanda Elementary School, this year. This monumental capital project was supported by our community and delivered on time and on budget by the district.

Students, staff, parents and community members toured the new school in August, prior to our opening for student attendance at the start of the school year. We have celebrated our first opening day, experienced

the new playground, produced video broadcast and student-hosted morning announcements each day, enhanced our security protocols, celebrated holidays and other traditional student activities and made new friendships with students and staff from both Mullen and Riverview Schools coming together.

The second year of the debt service payment for the TONA2020: Elementary School Consolidation Capital Project is due later this year. This increase in school taxes will appear as part of the "tax cap" calculation and will be included in the annual school tax bills to taxpayers due in the fall of 2024.

Additionally, in an effort to remain fiscally responsible, the district has sold Mullen Elementary School and will apply these proceeds to the debt service owed by the district from capital work as it comes due.

Riverview Elementary School is under contract to be sold to a developer of market-rate homes and apartments. The sale process has many steps and will require a public vote prior to any agreement being finalized. The district will continue to keep the community updated with information when it becomes available and appropriate to share. Our website continues to be a great resource to find current information on district matters, including this potential sale. It is most appropriate and responsible for the district to take action by having sold Mullen School, and now a potential sale of Riverview School, in a timely manner and for a price beneficial to the district and taxpayers to mitigate any further expenses, liabilities


Giving back to the community is an important part of the tradition and values in Tonawanda, and it is important for students and families to know that. TCSD is proud of how the students represent the school and district!




Best Buddies Gather for Holiday Party


