

State Testing Information

State testing will be here before we know it. Below is the schedule of and type of testing that will be taking place, beginning in April. We will have both computer-based testing (CBT) and paper-based testing (PBT). Please call the elementary office if you have any questions regarding the testing schedule.

CBT: ELA Grades 3, 4, & 5 will take place on April 29 & 30

PBT: Math Grade 3 will take place on May 8 & 9

CBT: Math Grades 4 & 5 will take place on May 13 & 14

CBT: Science Grade 5 will take place on May 6

A Message from Mrs. Peterson

As students are finishing up their i-Ready winter diagnostic, I wanted to take the opportunity to share some insights about this diagnostic tool. The i-Ready Diagnostic is a computer-based assessment in Mathematics and Reading that is given in the fall, winter, and spring. The purpose of this assessment is to determine how to best support your child's learning. After the completion of

the diagnostic, the tool provides research-based, individualized instruction that can help support and complement what your child is learning in the classroom. I-Ready is one of many data points we use to help understand your child's strengths and areas for growth in reading and math, and it provides us with insights into your child's academic progress and learning needs. Our ultimate goal is to use the data to ensure your child is receiving the right support and is successful here in school.

Kindergarten & First Grade- Explored and compared 4 types of robots- Dash, Dot, Ozobot, and Botley


In December First graders designed and 3D printed their own cookie cutters.


Second Grade- Made tinfoil skiiers and tested them out down our rain gutter mountain. Exploring physics and gravity.

If your child has strep throat or another bacterial infection, he/she should stay home until the antibiotic has been given for at least 24 hours and your health care provider has given permission for your child to return to school. We encourage you to seek medical attention when your child is sick and to follow your health care provider's recommendations about returning to school and other activities.
