MAS Grades 6-8 Academic Distinction

Congratulations to the over 130 students in grades 6-8 who earned Academic Distinction honors in the form of Principal's List, Honor Roll, and Distinguished Honor Roll. The students and their families were celebrated at the Maywood BOE meeting this past Thursday. Someone once said that 90% of success in life is just showing up. Although I think that statement has some truth, it does not apply to the kids we are honoring here tonight. Not only do you show up but you dig in and decide that working hard at something is important and purposeful. The kids we honor here tonight may think that the sheet of paper they are receiving, and the cake that they will be devouring, is nothing special but it is our jobs as their families and their school families to remind them of how important it is, and how proud we are of each of them.

A statement that I hear a lot, particularly in sports, is "oh everyone gets a trophy." Maybe getting a medal or trophy for finishing 37th in a soccer tournament that has 38 teams or getting a trophy for being the "world" champions of a competition held in Bogota NJ and not Bogota, Columbia seems a little silly, but the awards that will be bestowed tonight, Principal's List, Honor Roll, and Distinguished Honor Roll, do not fall into the category of everyone gets a trophy. They fall into the category of "you are getting a 'trophy' because you earned it" and put forth the effort that everyone had the chance to, but you decided to go get it.

So you get the sheet of paper and you grab a cookie or slice of cake and it goes away and we never think about it again. Although that may be the case for some, I can tell you that we see these sheets of paper turn into incredible things long after graduation. Because of kids like you who are earning these awards, you helped MAS be ranked as the tenth best middle school in all of Bergen County.

It is because of kids like you that there are over 60 Maywood students now members of the Becton National Honor Society and 3 Maywood students being executive officers on the Becton National honor society executive board. It is because of kids like you that many more Maywood students are in the national honor society in their other high schools and why last year and this year the Valedictorians of Becton are both Maywood students. It is because of kids like you that countless students are graduating in the top of their class at their respective high schools and earning honors in community service, scouting, athletics, the arts, and much more. Lastly it is because of kids like you that last year alone Maywood students accepted admission to schools such as Columbia, Harvard, Georgia Tech, Notre Dame, Villanova, Boston College, Cornell, Northeastern and many more, including excellent local schools in NJ. Every single student I just described, and many more, received the same sheet of paper you are receiving tonight when they were at MAS. So yah, it's just a sheet of paper, but it is important and you should be proud of what you have and will continue to accomplish.

So I conclude with the following statement – It is so much easier to just fail. Think about it. Instead of doing the work, paying attention in class, going the extra mile in a group project, getting through some tough nights of homework and caring about how well you do on an assessment, it is much easier and much less time consuming to just say, forget it, I don't care. You have decided that it may be easier to just not care but it is more important to care and to care enough that your efforts are recognized in the form of an academic distinction award. Here is why you should be even more proud. You are not just the students who are excelling academically and receiving these awards, but you are also the students who get to school on time, who help their fellow classmates when they need something, who are in the band or choir or art club or cheer team or crochet club, are an ambassador, play a school sport, participate in the play or musical or art show, or participate on the chess team. And don't ever forget this, apples don't make pears. In other words if you think you are this smart and well rounded and participate in everything and are just a plain ol good kid because you are just that cool, don't ever forget that the people sitting in the bleachers have a little bit to do with your success.

Just like you remember your practice schedule, your homework assignments and what you need to know for that math test, you may want to remember once and a while also to say hey thanks and I love you when your parents are least expecting it. Trust me, that is so much more special to them than any amount of certificates you will ever get.

To you, the students being honored, to our incredible MAS teachers/staff who help you get to this night every day in class, and the Memorial teachers/staff who prepared you and provided a foundation to get to this point when you were at Memorial, and to your families for being there for you, I say on behalf of our board of education, job well done, and congratulations.
