- March 26th, 4-6:30 PM
 - o Tables will be set up in the lobby, cafeteria, and one of the gyms
 - Students will be simultaneously presenting
 - 4-5 minute continuous presentations/discussions
 - Guests will move throughout the three areas and listen to students talk about their projects.
 - Guests may ask questions of the students and students should be able to describe their process: how they came up with the idea, what they did, who was involved, what resources were used, and how the project impacted their community.
 - The key is "impact." Projects should have a direct impact, not just be a theoretical idea.
 - The symposium is an opportunity to highlight the impacts that were made.
 - o Faculty, parents, mentors, and friends may be invited.
 - Awards will be given for outstanding projects.
 - Students should prepare presentations that include visual artifacts to share with guests.
