Ms. Calderone asked what the CI Mentorship is about.

Dr. Bilotti indicated that it's training towards a counseling license in the areas of therapeutic work.

Mr. Weaver asked about Items 15 and 16. He said he did not recall this in past Facilities Committee meetings. He was surprised when he saw the amount for the HVAC upgrades. He asked what the life expectancy is of the system.

Mr. Usami said that the project was budgeted for 2021-2022 and was delayed due to Covid. He mentioned that they went out to bid late last year and rebid earlier this year. He indicated that mechanical projects have become expensive. He indicated that this project has been discussed over the last two years. He commented that the budgeted construction cost was \$717,000 in 2021-2022 and Mr. Donahue estimated the increased cost to be about \$1 million. The bids were well above that figure. He commented that the negotiated price of \$1.4 million from Centralpack was very good in comparison to the bid prices. He said that an additional \$700,000 will be withdrawn from capital reserve to fund the project.

Dr. Bilotti commented that the project was updated in the Briefing before she arrived. It's in the Briefing in Mr. Donahue's section as Cafeteria AC.

Mr. Usami commented that he would need to ask Mr. Donahue about the life of the system, but he thought it may be about 40 with maintenance. He indicated that there are some that are starting to go and it's been about 40 years.

XVI. OLD BUSINESS

Monthly Suspension Report (attached)

Ms. Calderone mentioned that at a prior meeting it was said not to waste too many resources on those not going to a 2 or 4 year college. She indicated that all pathways deserve our full attention. She noted that 30% of students who attend a 4-year college drop out in their first year. She said it's important to provide resources to all students which will give them options. She indicated that the Board is responsible to see that each student's path is validated. She said success is different for each student.

Mrs. Varghese agreed. She said we should pay attention to those not planning to go to a 2 or 4-year college. She indicated having this discussion with Dr. Bilotti. She added that there is a robust internship program and she would like to have Mr. Joe Orlak come and speak about the opportunities the internship program can offer.

Mrs. Martin mentioned that a couple of years ago Mr. Orlak came and spoke to the Board about how the program has grown. This is a very important program and Mr. Orlak is very passionate about it.

Mrs. Varghese said it would be great to get an update since the program continues to grow. She indicated that the update will come sometime in January or February.

Mrs. Huang commented that the term "waste" came from a PFA meeting she attended and it was "wasting money is careless". She apologized for the comment. She indicated that at this PFA meeting there was discussion about the pressure for Hills students to go to college. She mentioned the college sweatshirt pictures creates a lot of pressure. She indicated that Mr. Wieland said it's a student event and not a school one. She mentioned that at the Fashion Show when the students come out on the runway, the college admittance is mentioned. They are looking for a balance. Mrs. Huang commented that Dr. Struncis and Ms. Schneider mentioned that each student has a personalized path that they follow.

Mrs. Martin said the pressure comes from the parents and their peers. On Commitment Day, students wear the college sweatshirts and shirts and it's not the school, it's the students choice to do so.

Mrs. Huang said the push back at the PFA meeting was that the students were proud of their acceptance. They discussed needing a balance.

Mrs. Varghese said that students who are on a different track need to be supported and emphasized more.

Mr. Weaver said in the upcoming presentation to the Board, he would like to know the course offerings before the internship program is discussed. The course offerings could lead students to the internship program. He commented that when the new schedule was introduced, a benefit was more course offerings. He would like to know what courses were added since the schedule was implemented. He asked how many students take an elective versus a Pascack Period. Ms. Keller concurred with Mr. Weaver. She mentioned the Board in favor of exploring options benefiting students after high school. She is looking at courses that provide tools to be a functioning adult.

Ms. Stephans was happy to see that counselors are going out to see colleges. She would like to see more PD, especially to alternative institutions. She suggested seeing what other districts do. Dr. Bilotti indicated that with Ms. Calderone's involvement with the county, there is a counselor at each school liaising with the Bergen County Workforce Development. This is for non-college bound students. The counselors are networked with other counselors in similar roles.

Mr. Weaver commented about the budget process that has begun and if courses will be added and the need for staff and sectioning.

Ms. Keller said she does not believe that the responsibility should be solely on guidance counselors. She indicated that there should be different avenues to reach the students looking for an alternative to college.

Ms. Calderone said a committee would be worthwhile.

Ms. Stephans suggested polling students for their interest and input.

Ms. Keller added asking if they are aware of... or if ... exists.

Mrs. Huang said the Financial Literacy class taken in freshman year versus senior year is very different. She mentioned that the Senior Seminar has been very helpful since tradespeople and professionals come and speak to the students..

Mr. Luisi suggested students start with the end game. There are multiple paths to success. He commented that the most charitable people and small business owners do not have a college degree (not all but many). He suggested looking long term, vision of the future, to de-stigmatize the path. He said there is no wrong choice or better choice.

Mrs Varghese asked if there is a career center or something similar. She indicated someone who will show students their options.

Dr. Bilotti said some of these are in SCOIR. She added that Naviance has a push down (career exploration) to the middle school.

Ella Gokhale commented that the students who are motivated will go into SCOIR. They will pay attention because they are looking for that information. She received an email from guidance about a survey for after high school plans. She indicated that the questions were college related. Mrs. Varghese would like to reach all students. She commented that a personal relationship is more important than SCOIR. She asked if the survey came from guidance.

Dr. Bilotti did not receive it, so she will look into it.

Andrew Varian commented that there is a stigma around people who want to go to trade school. He said he takes honors and AP courses and the students in those classes want to go to the best 4-year college. He believes that there needs to be an emphasis on trades. The plumbers and construction workers are essential to society. He referenced some very successful people who did not graduate college or go to college.

Ms. Keller said we need to be realistic and see what options are available. She indicated that some students may not have the financial means to go to college. She commented that the options are not just college or trade schools, there is the military, etc. She mentioned potential skills such as investments, how to secure a loan, how to buy a home, how to do taxes.

Mr. Stankus said that many students feel the pressure of having to go to college. He mentioned that sometimes students will select a school for the sake of going to college and that it may be the best fit. He suggested a survey earlier in high school to see if they are intending to go to college or not.

Mrs. Martin said sometimes the students' intentions change. She mentioned that we might not know the path. She commented about social influencers and their earnings are more than the Board's. Who knew? She said things keep changing and the district needs to follow the change. Mr. Weaver related that his son is going through the process currently. He advised him to select the best college that he will have the most fun at the most reasonable price and figure it out along the way.

Andrew Varian commented that he received a scholarship to a college and his parents would like him to attend that college. His first reaction was no since it was the best college, but after hearing tonight's comments he is starting to change his mind.

Mr. Stankus said students should be aware that many students will change their majors and end up with a degree that they never thought they would obtain or a career outside of college.

XVII. NEW BUSINESS

Mrs. Martin thanked Mr. Luisi for what he has done on the Board and for the community (coaching). She mentioned Mr. Luisi's flexibility, creativity and friendship. She said she enjoyed working with him and she will miss him.

Ms. Calderone said it's been a pleasure working with Mr. Luisi. She was grateful for his thoughtful contributions and valuable perspectives. She appreciated his candor on not seeking re-election as he acknowledged that he could not devote his full attention to his role as a board member. She commented that it spoke to his integrity and to the Board's commitment to its mission. She was grateful for time together and wished him the best.

Mr. Luisi commented that as a non-educator he learned a lot from everyone. He indicated that the Board made a great choice in bringing in Dr. Bilotti. He was happy to get to know the student reps and they have a great future. He said he is proud of the community and glad he added a little bit of value. He thanked the Board.

Mrs. Huang thanked Mr. Luisi for bringing his steady integrity.

Mrs. Varghese thanked Mr. Luisi. She mentioned that Gia Guzman will be taking Mr. Luisi's seat.
