

FROM THE DESK OF THE DEAN

BEHAVIOR STRATEGIES PARENTS CAN USE TODAY

Think about things your child really enjoys and finds rewarding or motivating. What are a few of your child's favorite activities?

- 1. Keep in mind your child's strengths and interests. Set aside time to spend with your child when they are engaged in activities that matter to them.
- 2. Establish clear expectations at home. Keep your "house rules" similar to school expectations. The key is to be fair and age appropriate when you reinforce the expectations.
- 3. Create routines for your family. Organize the day so your child knows what is happening. Give your child a helpful transition warning to let them know what is coming next.
- 4. Anticipate challenges and plan accordingly. Preventing challenging behavior is easier than addressing it in the moment. Know what things or times of day trigger your child to engage in challenging behavior. Choose activities where your child will experience success.
- 5. Try to be consistent and know how you are going to react. Say what you mean and mean what you say.
- 6. Model the behavior you want your child to learn.
- 7. Communicate clearly what behavior you want your child to demonstrate. Phrase directions in the positive, telling your child what you want them to do, not what you don't want them to.
- 8. Talk about feelings and use visuals to help your child understand. Tell them you understand how they feel.
- 9. Look behind the behavior and see what your child may be trying to tell you. Try to remember that however a child is behaving, the child is doing the best he or she can at that moment.
- 10. Use positive reinforcement often. Genuine, specific praise has a powerful effect on your children's behavior. This includes their efforts to work hard at following your directions and any small steps in the right direction.

Music & Choir

Encore Music

Our Dentzler music classes continue to utilize "QuaverEd: Music" to explore many concepts and skills in music. Some of these include:

4th Grade: Note durations, Tempos, Timbre, Orchestra and Band Instruments, Fretted Instruments, Chords, and Harmony. We are also planning to use QuaverMusic's Guitar Course to learn to play basic guitar in our 4th grade music classes.

3rd Grade: The Classical Period (composers/orchestra/music), Dynamics, and more Rhythm,

2nd Grade: The Baroque Period (composers/orchestra/music), Dynamics, and Singing more Solfège.

1st Grade: Exploring our voices (whisper, talk, shout, and sing), Pitches and Intervals, Sound and Rest, Loud and Soft.

Kindergarten: Using our voices to explore: High and Low Pitches, Melodic Contour, Patterns of 2, 3, and 4, Intro to Instrument Families.


LETS TALK ABOUT ATTENDANCE:

Between the cold weather and all the germs going around, getting to school can be challenging. Nonetheless, being in school is important. Just missing 2 days a month can impact a child's ability to read. If you have any questions about attendance or need help please reach out to Ms. Eland at 440-843-8979.

What You Can Do

It's important to keep track of how many days your child is actually missing. There are also things you can do to help your child want to go to school, or at least not try to avoid it:

- Talk with your child. Try to find out the reason for missing school. Together, you can try to brainstorm some solutions.
- Call the school and talk with an adult who knows your child like their teacher, school counselor, administrator.. Find out what the school can do to help.
- Get tips on how to respond when kids say they don't want to go to school.



ENGLISH LEARNERS

As we start the month of February, the Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment (OELPA) testing will begin. Each current EL student will take four state tests: Listening, Reading, Writing, and Speaking for the assessment of their English Language Proficiency levels. The test is graded on a 5 point system. Each domain will be scored as 1-Beginning, 2- Early Intermediate, 3- Intermediate, 4- Advanced and 5- Proficient. Students who test overall as Proficient will exit the EL program and will no longer receive services. We will get the results of these tests by the end of the school year and use the scores to determine next year's EL groups. A copy of the results will be sent home with the EL students' end of year reports.

We are proud of the progress our EL learners have made this year. Many of our newcomers began this school year without any English vocabulary and are now beginning to speak in phrases and in some cases, writing English sentences. The EL teachers closely monitor the progress on Lexia of each of their EL students. In many cases, students have leveled up in Lexia numerous times this semester. Dentzler's multilingual students are phenomenal!



F.A.S.T.

Our Dentzler FAST program has already completed its first round in the Fall. We graduated with 8 families. Families love the FAST program and have grown closer as a family. We will be hosting another session in the Spring. There will be a flier coming home with your child in March with more details. Our FAST sessions are offered to students in grades K-4 and are held on Wednesday evenings at the school. It is a wonderful opportunity for you and your family to spend quality time together, make projects/crafts, talk, interact with other families, eat dinner and grow as a Dentzler community. SECOND STEP

As part of our PBIS Initiative at Dentzler, our teachers have been infusing a Social Emotional Learning (SEL) curriculum into their daily routines. With a lesson focused on each week, this curriculum teaches our students important skills such as how to have empathy, emotion management, problem solving skills, friendship skills, and responsibility.

The weekly focus for each lesson varies. Each grade level is focusing on the end of Unit 2 which is based on Empathy, and the beginning of Unit 3 which focuses on Emotion Management. Please talk with your child about these lessons, it will help to reinforce them at home! If you have any questions or concerns, please contact your child's homeroom teacher.

Kindergarten: Accidents, Caring and Helping, We Feel Feelings in Our Bodies, Managing Frustration, Calming Down Strong Feelings

1st Grade: Accidents, Showing Care and Concern, Identifying Our Own Feelings, Strong Feelings, Calming Down Anger

2nd Grade: Showing Compassion, Predicting Feelings, Introducing Emotion Management, Managing Embarrassment, Handling Making Mistakes

3rd Grade: Showing Compassion, Making Friends, Introducing Emotion Management, Managing Test Anxiety, Handling Accusations

4th Grade: Avoid Jumping to Conclusion, Handling Put-Downs, Handling Put-Downs, Solving Problems, Making a Plan

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Parents/Guardians wishing to pre-register their child going into kindergarten for the 2025-2026 school year will be able to complete the online registration process beginning January 1.

Parents must have A COPY of the following documents scanned and available to pre-register for kindergarten online:

- Student's birth certificate
- Student's immunization record
- Two documents proving residency (must not be older than 60 days): Electric, gas, water, sewer, cable/internet, monthly mortgage statement, or lease or bank statement.
- Parent/guardian Photo ID
- Custody Papers (if applicable)
- Individualized Education Program (IEP) or Evaluation Team Report (ETR) or 504 (If applicable)

Children age 5 by September 30th, **may** enter Kindergarten.

Children age 6 by September 30th, **must** enter Kindergarten.

HOMEWORK CENTER AT CCPL

Our Student Success Center program helps students in grades K – 8 improve their grades and subject comprehension. Student Success Centers are available at 10 branches. Students who participate in the program receive homework assistance and/or academic enrichment from each of our centers' staff in English language arts, math, reading, science and social studies.

Each Homework Center session is 1 hour and 15 minutes. Registration is required.
